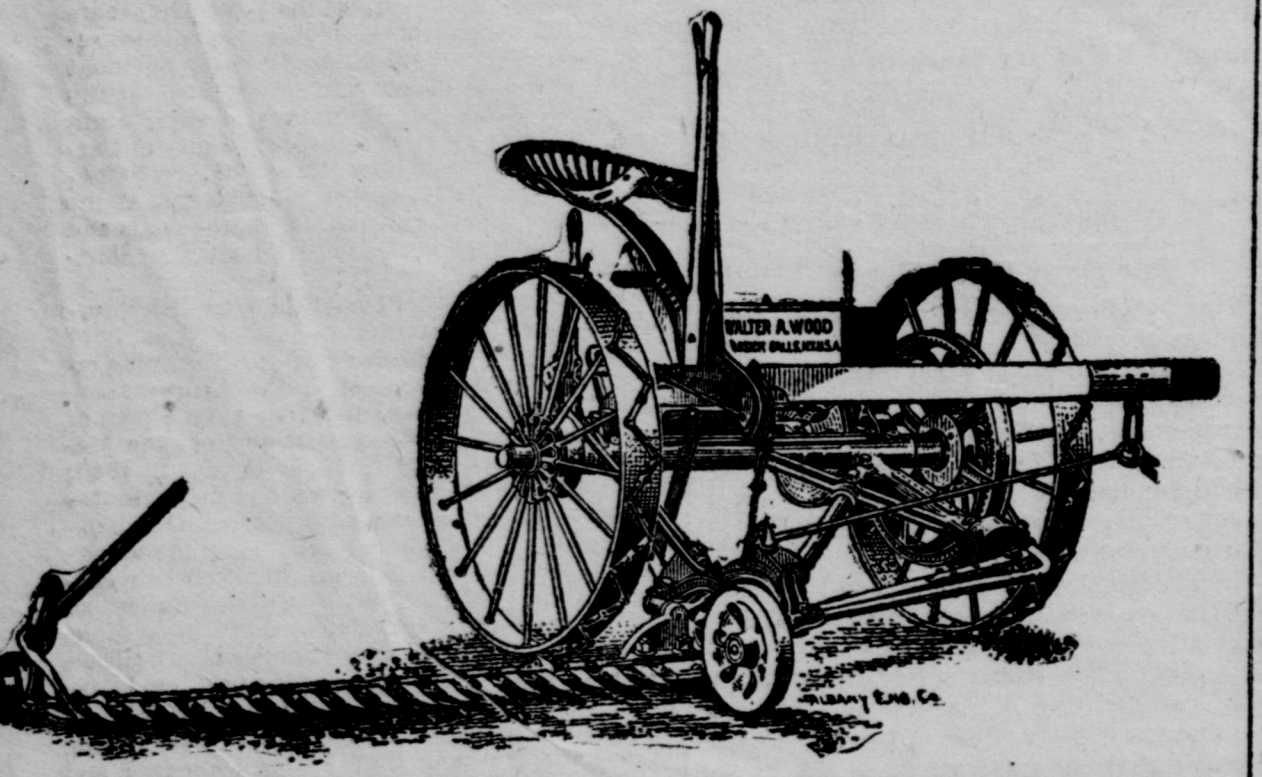

## THE WAR.

LONDON, MAY 18-916 p.m.—Mackenzie has been relieved.

8.40 p.m.—The despatch of the Associated Press announcing the relief of Mackenzie was posted outside the Mansion House and the news rapidly spread. A large crowd collected and at this hour all the streets in the neighborhood are already resounding with cheers.

The war office at 9 o'clock announced that no news had been received, but that the lord mayor, Mr. A. J. Newton, in his official capacity, announced the joyful news to the crowd outside. The lord mayor was accompanied by the members of the House of Commons, where an immense procession of Col. Baden Powell was displayed bearing the inscription: "Mackenzie relieved."

While the cheering was at its height, the lord mayor briefly addressed the assembly, saying:

"I am glad to announce that Mackenzie has been relieved. The speech was interrupted by redoubled cheering and the singing of Rule Britannia, after which the lord mayor declared that the relief of Mackenzie was a great triumph for the British Empire and a great triumph for the British people."
