A Curious Timepiece.

In the exhibition of clocks and bronzes at the Paris Exposition is a very curious and unique timepiece devised by Mr Passerat. On a square pedestal of wood covered with bronze decorations, rests a plate of ordinary size. The plate has marked on its upper surface a clock dial, and there is a small tigure of a swan lying in the bottom. If a little water is poured into the plate (enough to float the swap), the latter immediately wims to the edge of the plate and indicates the hour with its beak. In the interior of the Sca p the box is a clock movement acting on a vertical pivot to which is attached a horizon.
