### A MORE EXCELLENT WAY.

Then the cabman makes his charge, and the police surgeon makes his, and the agents make their own claim for special duty, and this bill is presented to the host of the establishment where the culprit took his last overflowing glass."

That is far better than taking drunken men home to beat their wives, drive their children out of the house, and break up the furniture. Furthermore, it is well to make the saloon keeper pay the bills, and save the costs which might be required to prosecute a drunken man for the cruelties he would be likely to inflict on his family; but how much better it would be to abolish the saloon and stop drunkenness altogether!—Methodist Protestant.

### Twenty Cigarettes Kill Forty Frogs.

That the cigarette is a deadly poison is susceptible of the most positive scientific proof. A few months ago I had all the nicotine removed from a cigarette, making a solution of it. I injected half the quantity into a frog, with the effect that the frog died almost instantly. The other half was administered to another frog with like effect. Both frogs were full grown and of average size. The conclusion is evident that a single cigarette contains poison enough to kill two frogs. A boy who smokes twenty cigarettes a day has inhaled enough poison to kill forty frogs. Why does the poison not kill him? It does kill him. If not immediately, he will die sooner or later of weak heart, Bright's disease or some other malady which scientific physicians everywhere now recognize as the natural results of chronic nicotine poisoning.

In place of the often beautiful, many times wickedly obscene pictures which cigarette manufacturers often send in connection with their packages, or offer as a premium, every package of cigarettes ought to bear a skull and cross-bones, and should be marked "deadly poison," like rough on rats, strychnia and other deadly drugs.—Dr. J. H. Kellog.

### Like a Wooden Leg.

Some people's religion is just like a wooden leg. There is neither warmth nor life in it; and although it helps them to hobble along it never becomes a part of them, but has to be strapped on every morning.

In an address by Dr. I. N. Love, of New York, a recognized medical authority, delivered before the Mississippi Valley Medical Association at Asheville, North Carolina, in Oct. 1900, we find the following emphatic statements: "The numerous mental wrecks, youths who have come under my care during the past ten years, whose lives were failures, or who fill suicides' graves, impress me that today tobacco stands as the gravest danger confronting the new century, and the medical profession has a fearful responsibility in educating young men and their parents to appreciate this danger. I am firm in the view that the medical profession must study calmly, tolerantly, temperately, the problems related to stimulants of all kinds, but tobacco and alcohol in particular, and they put themselves in best form for doing the best work along these lines and wielding their greatest influence for good by themselves being exemplars of temperance, self-restraint, self-denial and correct living."

#### Pasture for Hogs.

Pasturage is necessary to the successful raising of hogs. Not only is green feed the best, and almost indispensable for growing swine, but the exercise required in grazing is just as important. The cheapest feed for hogs is that grown by the owner and harvested by the stock. In the southwest there is no lack of forage plants for every month in the year, and hence pork can be produced at less cost than elsewhere. When this is not done, it is not the fault of the country nor of the hogs but is the result of bad management on the part of the hog raiser.—Farm and Ranch.

#### New Insect Pest.

New York, July 17.—An insect new to the farmers of West Chester county, and it is thought a novel pest, has made its appearance. It has become locally known as the flying boring bug and is doing much damage to fruit trees. The new insect is described as being as large as a bumblebee having a long hard sting with which it sears the young trees and fruit. The flying bug was first seen in Orange county and later devastated two West Chester County townships. The bug, will, it is said, destroy whole fields of grain.

### A Floating Church.

The Roman Catholics of Holme, in Huntingdonshire, England, live in a scattered parish extending over a wide area.
