A STARTLING ANALYSIS.

The Baptist *Argus* (Louisville, Ky.) suggests the intimate relation of the saloon to the assassination of President McKinley as follows:—

The American saloons are the nesting places of anarchy in all its multiplied forms and expressions. They are the deadly enemies to law and order. They are the schools of all manner of lawlessness, eating ulcers, rotting out the heart of patriotism and loyalty to every form of government. No man ever goes at a step to the awful extreme of the assassin. He must go through stages of preparation. His finer feelings must be brutalized. Before he is fit for such direful work, the common instincts of humanity must become demoralized.

Any and all laws of the state meant to restrain the (liquor) business are thought of, spoken about and resented as despotic interference with that large liberty of which they regard themselves the especial exponents. Governments of all sorts are despised. Youths are trained to despise home government. Churches are regarded as engines of oppression. The laws of the land are held in contempt. Generally speaking and speaking within safe limits, the liquor business of America is a vast organized conspiracy against law and order, human and divine.

The President is the highest exponent of law in the land and law protects property. Why should the head of despotism not be taken off? That is Herr Most's reasoning, and he is the exponent of the saloon in its enmity to all law.

There never was a cleaner case of hatching and nurturing vipers in the bosom, than the protection of the saloon by law. The law gives its sanction to a business, the very spirit and workings of which are for the destruction of the law. We turn men into the temple of our liberties, torches in hand, interested to burn it down over our heads. Nothing but a widespread public insanity can account for the folly of the American people in allowing the saloon business. Now and then there is a partial awakening, but the dread disease is in the blood, and the masses are lulled to sleep again. The pistol shot of the assassin of our noble President ought at least to turn all eyes in the direction from which it came. The saloon is the very nesting place of anarchy. If we are wise we will break up these nests.

BEER AND LIGHT WINES.

One solution to the liquor evil that is sometimes offered, proposes that spirituous beverages be prohibited, but the sale of beer and light wines be allowed to continue. The advocates of this plan are apt to cite the examples of France and Germany, where these lighter beverages are used almost universally, and yet, as it is claimed, with very moderate, if any, evil consequences. This apprehension is a popular one, we admit, but what basis it has in fact we are at a loss to discover, for if news from France and Germany is reliable, the governments of those nations are beside themselves with worry over the disastrous effects of the drink evil.

France has already passed restrictive, if not prohibitory, regulations concerning the use of wine and beer in a portion of her army, while Germany shows signs of awakening to a similar peril. A writer in the *Kreuz Zeitung*, in advocating the instant disuse of intoxicants in army and navy, shows that in one hundred and twenty German army prisons 46 per cent of all the murderers committed their crime while under the influence of drink, while 63 per cent of cases of manslaughter, 74 per cent of serious assault and 77 per cent of criminal immorality come under the same head. In the navy, of 1671 cases of punishable offences, during the last six years, three-fourths of the serious cases are due to drunkenness. It would seem, in view of these figures, that the belief that Germany is immune from such disasters is a misapprehension of the deepest kind.—*Ram's Horn*.

A terrible gun accident has occurred on board the British battleship Royal Sovereign outside of the harbor of Astakos Greece. An artilleryman forgot to close the breech before the gun was fired. One officer and six artillerymen were killed outright and the captain and 13 sailors were seriously injured.

LOSSES OF BRITISH SHIPS.

According to a recent Parliamentary return the number of losses and minor casualties of vessels of the United Kingdom in 1899—1900 was 5,463. There were 420 vessels, of 179,676 tons, totally lost, or less by 164 vessels and 27,234 tons than the average for the last twenty-four years. In the last twenty-four years there have been 6,566 British ships wrecked and 40,797 lives lost. The seas about the United Kingdom are particularly dangerous, as Caesar found over nineteen hundred years ago, and the Spaniard's later. As many as 79 foreign vessels, of 47,267 tons, were wrecked and became total losses in 1899—1900 near British coasts.

WORLD'S GREAT DAMS.

The British Government has undertaken to restore the ancient order of things by storing the flood waters of the Nile, so that by irrigating, once more the desert lands of Egypt will be in a condition to supply cotton, cereals and other products enough for the markets of the world, since three crops can be raised in a year. This is to be accomplished by the erection of dams across the channel of the Nile. Two of these are now nearing completion, thanks to British energy and capital, which has made the undertaking possible. It is of interest to know that 25,000 natives and Italians are now at work in shipment of 12,500 each by night and day in completion of the dam. The same quarries that supplied stone to King Mena are being worked by them, and the grooves and notches of laborers who extracted rough material for the temples of Philae and Cleopatra's needle were found by the men who are using modern implements propelled by steam to obtain stone for the dams.—*Leslie's Magazine*.

A new cattle food is made by grinding cornstalks and mixing them with a low grade of molasses. This new food is pressed into cakes under a hydraulic press and can be shipped as easily as bricks or cordwood. For feeding it is broken up and mixed with water. Actual tests have been made and samples have been sent to agricultural stations in Europe. The reports from all sources are very encouraging. This food will be particularly valuable for cavalry in the tropics, and the food cakes can be made at a minimum cost in Cuba and the southern states, where thousands of tons of low grade molasses go to waste annually.

Successful Tests of a New Dynamite Gun.

A New York despatch says highly successful tests of a new dynamite gun of destructive powers in excess of any weapon hitherto designed have been privately conducted by a special board of officers of the bureau of ordnance of the United States army at Fisher's island. The government has for several years been engaged in the erection on Fisher's island of fortifications on a colossal scale, intended to make the eastern entrance to the sound impregnable to naval attack and secure the safety of all the cities along the sound from New London to New York. In this system of defense the new dynamite gun, which is mounted so as to cover the channel between Fisher's island and Plum island, on which heavy batteries have already been erected, is expected to play an important part.

It is of the same pneumatic type as the guns of the batteries now in position at Sandy Hook and San Francisco. Being forty feet long, with a calibre of fifteen inches, but embodying many new features, including rapidity of action and accuracy of fire. A new type of fuse has also supplied which assures absolute precision of explosion of the shells both on impact and by delay action. The test were made before a board consisting of Majors McNutt and Birney of the bureau of ordnance and many artillery officers from the forts in the vicinity.

With the full calibre projectile the gun proved its ability to hurl 500 lbs of nitro-gelatin, said to be sufficient to annihilate any battleship afloat, a distance of about 30,000 yards with a degree of accuracy not excelled by the latest types of heavy rifle in the ordnance. Two days were devoted to the tests. The first shot hurled a distance of 5,763 yards, bursting on impact with the water and sending a column of water 300 feet into the air. With a ten inch carrying 200 pounds of explosive, the extreme range was found to be 5,480 yards, the shell exploding under water with the delay action of two seconds.

In the test for accuracy five eight inch shells were dropped at the respective ranges of 5043, 5055, 5020, 5,040, and 4070 yards, all of which would have taken effect, assuming that the target had been a battleship about three miles away, or about double the distance of 2500 yards, now generally accepted as the limit of a practical fighting range.

In the test for rapidity of fire, five shells weighing 1055 pounds, or more than a ton each, were discharged in eleven minutes and fifty-five seconds, almost bringing the weapon within the class of rapid fire pieces.

A companion gun has just been mounted in the fortifications at Hamilton Head, defending the naval station at Port Royal, S. C., and will be tested by the same board within a few days.
