OPEN BRANCHES IN ENG-LAND.

Slater Shoe Company Decides on Expansion.

MR. CHAS. E. SLATER OUTLINES THE PLAN TO INVADE GREAT

BRITAIN. "They don't appreciate Canadians sufficiently in England, we are all Americans," said Mr. Chas. E. Slater, president and general manager of the Slater Shoe Co. yesterday, as he chatted freely about his business trip to European centres. He has only lately returned from a trip to London and Paris, made with the object of extending the Company's foreign business, with the result that he is convinced that the only way to permanently secure a share of the British trade is to open a series of Slater Shoe Stores, on the same special system of selling and advertising to the consumer direct, as has made the Slater Shoe so well known and popular in Canada. He spent about six weeks in investigating the shoe trade and noted the tremendous trade of the London Shoe Co., and of dozens of others who have as many as from 75 to 300 retail branches in different parts of the Kingdom. The English companies do their boot and shoe business largely on the multiple system; that is, a firm like Manfield, or Lilley & Skinner own many branches, but selling all kinds of boots instead of one special make or kind. There are no English manufacturers specializing like The Slater Shoe Company, making Goodyear welted goods alone, which are bound to replace the hand made shoe, as soon as their merits become properly known

to the public. "It is hard to realize the possibili-We can land goods in England in less time, and for considerably less cost for transportation than we can in British Columbia, and just think for a moment of the difference in 'Darwin's theory must be correct,' population." The Canadian field is remarked Mrs. Enpeck as she stopped | limited, as is well shown by the export leather business. The tanners little fellows certainly have many of Canada shipped nine million pounds of sole leather to England last year. The English manufacturer 'Pshaw!' exclaimed Enpeck. 'A is fast losing ground in his own and shoes going into England, and this, coupled with the Government rebate to manufacturers in Canada, of 90 per cent on foreign material used in manufacture for export, made it plain sailing for his company. This rebate applies to Bermuda and Australia as well as in other countries with which Mr. Slater arranged for agencies while in London, which is, of course, the centre of the shipping trade of the

world. Trade conditions, in boots and shoes especially, were very different from those in Canada. As a rule the stores were smaller, as also were the stocks carried. There the retailers carry a mass of all kinds of stuff, packed into one shop, as well as displaying so many different kinds of goods in the windows (using almost every inch of space), that it is bewildering to purchasers No extensive advertising was done by the retailers. Asked if a factory might be successfully operated in England on a basis similar to the one here, Mr. Slater said, the conditions were such, that in his opinion it would be out of the question for a good many

vears to come. The labor unions work to the disadvantage of the English manufacturer when taking into consideration the increase in imports. For instance, the workmen are prohibited from making more than a specified number of boots per day, and are very arbitrary on the question of the introduction of new and improved machinery. Plenty of workmen were idle, and he believed that general decadence had set in throughout the manufacturing industries, To use his own words, "there are rafts of American and German goods of all kinds elbowing the Englishmade goods out of business." He was compelled to smile at the utter lack of appreciation of Canadian industry, brains and enterprise, in England, Whatever prestige American business men had gained in the English market reflected to the credit of Canadians, because the average Britisher did not discriminate at all between Canadians and

Americans. In Paris, too, he saw an opening for Canadian shoes, but all that and the many elements of the opening of branches were details that would follow in due course.



Nebuchadnezzar's Throne Room Discovered.

The German Oriental Society confirms the reports to the effect that Dr. Koldewey has succeeded in discovering Nebuchnezzar's Throne Room at Babylon. It is a gigantic building about 60 ft wide by 160 feet long. Exactly opposite the door is the niche in which once the Royal Throne stood, and on both sides and on the northern front of the hall are richly covered ornaments, in good preservation, which will doubtless prove of the highest historical and artistic importance. The German expedition has also begun excavation in the city of Babylon, near the present village of Jumjuma, and has already discovered a goodly number of inscribed clay tablets, which, according to the testimony of Dr. Weissbach, the Assyriologist, of the expedition, contains letters, psalms, and vocabularies. They are, therefore, all documents of the deepest interest, and are especially calculated to further the study of the Old Testament. With the help of new railway material, the work on the Dining Room Suites. hill of Amranibu Ali is shortly to be resumed, and the excavation of this unique pantheon of the Babylonian metropolis, hidden deep in the earth, promise rich and varied discoveries. The German Oriental Society does not confine its activity to Babylon. It has secured two other hills, named Fara and Abu Hatab, which are believed to contain particularly fine monuments dating from 4000 years BC. The two hills are not far from Nuffar, where the American excavations are being made, and the Sultan has already issued an irade permitting the excavations.



Sydney is Orange Mart.

Australia has one of the most suitable orange-growing districts of the world. What apple culture is in England that of the orange is in New South Wales, the Parramatta district, near Sydney, being to Australia what Kent, with its countless luxuriant orchards, is to the United Kingdom. The scenery of the Parramatta River is not unlike that of the Thames above Richmond, only more romatic and beautiful, especially during springtime, when the wonderful profusion of wild flowers imparts an additional charm to the picture. Even the masses of rock, which in many places rise boldly from the edges of the stream, are decked with bright-colored clusters of Australian native flowers of the most lovely and varied

The trees also claims a large share of admiration not only from the lover of the beautiful in nature, but also from the utilitarian, for they include the orange, with its bright green foliage, and dainty white flowers or rich golden fruit, both often seen on the tree at one and the same time. The orange is not only a picturesque adjunct to the garden, but also more than repays the trouble and cost of cultivation.
