## SEWING DONE BY ANTS.

Ants are credited with so many marvelous accomplishments that a new one must be remarkable to the noteworthy. Mr. E. G. Green of Ceylon, an authority upon insect habits, has, however, made an observation which is well worth putting on record. He has watched red ants holding grubs in their mouths and using the web they spin to repair a rent in their nest.

Some leaves which had been fastened together by the ants were separated by Mr. Green, and in a short time after he saw small white grubs being passed backward and forward across the gap. Closer observation showed that each grub was held in the jaws of one of the worker ants, and its movements were directed as required. A continuous thread of silk issued from the mouth of each grub and was used by the ants to sew up the rent in their shelter.

There was no grubs in the neighborhood, and those used were obtained from a nest at some distance. This deliberate use of a naturally formed web as a sewing thread is as astonishing as any instance of the intelligence of ants yet observed.

The British government will hereafter send all mail from Australia to London by way of the United States. The decision to make this change in the Australian mail route is the result of a recent test in which mail sent from Sydney to London by way of the Union Pacific, Burlington and New York Central railroads reached its destination seven days sooner than it would have done had it been sent by the Suez canal, the old route. Importance attaches to the new departure in handling this mail because it consists largely of documents for the British parliament.

### Fabulous Prices for London Land.

Fabulous prices are obtained for land in the city of London. That a freehold on Cornhill should have sold for a little over £53 3s. per square foot is surprising, but not so much so as the sale of the St. Peter-upon-Cornhill land, which a few months ago brought over £20 a foot. Land within a furlong radius of the Bank of England is worth about 7s. an inch. Five hundred feet of land in Cheapside was sold recently for £13,000, or £26 a square foot.

### MUSICAL SNAILS.

A German scientist recently pointed out that snails were able to draw immense weights, and now a French naturalist claims that there are few, if any, animals which have a higher appreciation of music than snails, says the New York Herald.

This naturalist is M. S. Jourdain, and his views on the subject are expressed at length in a paper which he has addressed to the French Biological society.

Place some snails on a pane of glass, he says, and you will find that as they move over it, they will make musical sounds similar to those which a person can produce by wetting his finger and then rubbing it around a glass tumbler. Complete airs, he points out, have been played on tumbler in this way, and he expresses the opinion that quite as good results can be obtained by using snails instead of fingers.

It is a curious fact that at least half a dozen scientists are now carefully studying snails. The reason, according to one of them, is because these little animals are extraordinarily sympathetic and intelligent. Indeed, so highly gifted are they supposed to be that a writer did not hesitate to ascribe to them a few months ago the honor of being "the precursors of the wireless telegraph system."
