With sparkling anecdote and homely illustration, Sir Robert Ball, Lowndean professor of astronomy geology in Cambridge University, England, and former Royal Astronomer of Ireland, delivered an address on the "Cause of an Ice Age' at Columbia University, New York, on Friday last.

Another glacial period, Sir Robert said, is to come again, when a great hemispheres, crushing, grinding, benumbing all things for hundreds of thousands of years, and in its nature worse than famine, flood and pestilence.
