

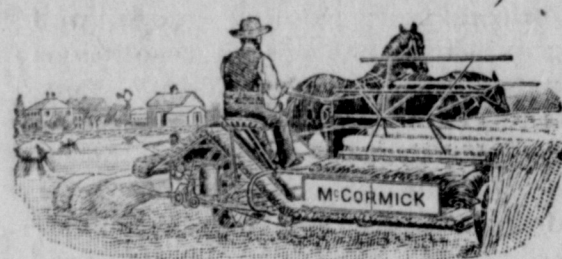

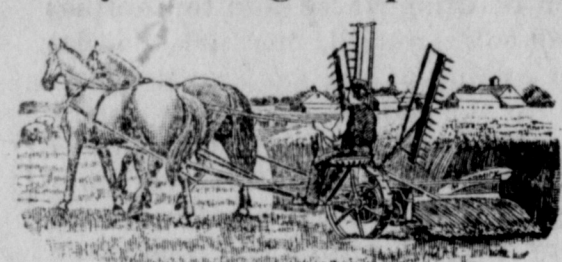

## General News Items.

The four children of William Kronberg and his servant girl were suffocated in a fire at Portland, Me., on Sunday morning, and died before the firemen could reach them. The fire was in a two and a half story building at the corner of Franklin and Federal streets.

A Paris despatch states: An order has been issued to the troops in the department of the Hautes-Alpes to kill all pigeons crossing the frontier. This action has been taken by the government because of the discovery of the fact that spies were utilizing pigeons to send reports from the country.

The last census shows that the city of Chicago contains 961 churches of all denominations, the Catholics leading with 136. Sixty denominations are represented in the city.

A St Petersburg despatch says: During the maneuvers near here a squadron of cavalry was ordered suddenly to charge; it galloped into a river and 51 men are reported to have been drowned.

Mr. Sverin Bryngolfsson, an Icelandic man who was instrumental in inducing some five hundred of his countrymen to the Canadian Northwest as settlers has gone back to bring more of them to Canada. The Icelanders make good settlers and are pleased with the Canadian North-West.

The cost of Alaska was \$7,200,000. Revenue exceeding \$9,000,000 has been received from the territory since the purchase, and the value of the products exported every year from Alaska is about \$15,000,000, these being gold, fish and furs.

A Jersey calf at Galesburg, Mich., was treated to a breakfast of fresh milk and then turned out to gambol on the green. It frolicked to its heart's content, but suddenly dropped dead. ## Cresceus Trots a Mile in 2.04 1-4 at Indianapolis.

Indianapolis, Ind., Aug. 21.—Cresceus (2.02½) stepped a wonderful mile here this afternoon over the state fair grounds track, clipping one quarter of a second off the track record for trotters, made by Nancy Hanks in 1892. His time by quarters was as follows: 31½s., 1.02½, 1.34, 2.04½.

Cresceus was forced to go against a bracing wind down the backstretch, which had its effect. The mile, however, was well rated, and the time a decided surprise, considering it was his first start. He seems to have the power to reach the two-minute mark, if his improvement shall be as great as it has been since his preparation for racing began this summer.

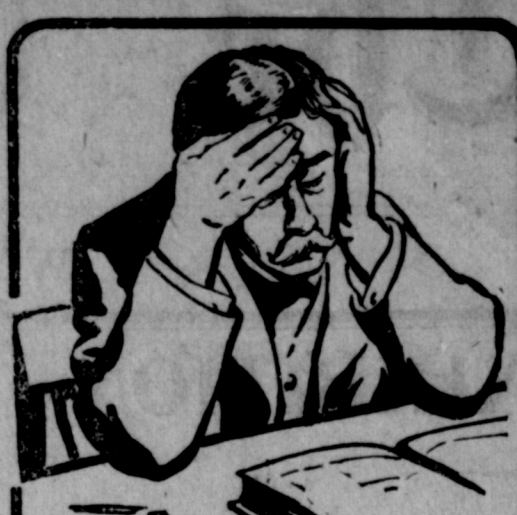

## MOVING GRAINS.

In the wheat growing belts of the Northwest, and in Kansas and Oklahoma, the shipping of grain to the markets is now at its height and presents a busy scene. The farmers haul their grain directly to the cars—that is, those who wish to sell it at once—and it is dumped into the cars by manual labor. To see hundreds of wagons lined up beside a string of empties is no uncommon sight.

On the smooth plains an innovation in hauling grain to market has been introduced this year. Men who own threshing machines have no use for their traction engines after threshing has finished, so they hitch them to five or six wagon loads of grain and haul them to market for the farmer. The charge is light in comparison to employing men with teams to do the same work.

its agents stationed along the railway lines buying grain. This grain is bought by the agents at the prices prevailing that morning in Chicago. The agents are paid by commission and the strife for buying often grows fierce, even to the point of cutting commissions with the farmers. The grain is tested by means of brass weighing machines.

Immediately on a farmer's arrival at the market his wagon is at once surrounded by buyers. They have a verbal agreement, by which each takes his turn in bidding—that is, they draw straws in the morning to see who shall buy the second, and so on. This manner of buying is followed throughout the day. But if one buyer does not bid as much as the farmer wants the latter may offer it to another at a higher price.

Vast sums of money are paid out daily to the farmers and the village banks often have to draw for funds by wire to meet the demand, for nearly every farmer has his checks, given in payment for grain, cashed at once, and takes the currency home with him. This year the demand for cash will not be so large, because the farmers are better off financially than ever before and will not need to convert their checks into ready money at once.

In sections of Kansas the grain is moving to markets very slowly on account of the extremely hot weather. Oklahoma has begun to ship trainloads of wheat and Indian Territory is shipping out its corn.

The state crown is now in the hands of goldsmiths to repair. The king wore the crown on his return to Buckingham Palace from the abbey, after the coronation, and when entering the state coach he struck it against the roof, damaging it slightly. The crown, together with the jewels set in it, is valued at \$2,500,000.

A despatch from North Bay, Quebec says:—"A man named C. H. Roads, of New Brunswick, jumped off the Winnipeg train this morning. He went to the dock, handed his watch and \$8 to a man, told him where to send them and jumped into the lake. He was drowned in a few feet of water. The body was recovered."

In a despatch from Geneva, the correspondent of the Daily Mail reports the arrest of 23 Italians, supposed to be anarchists, in connection with an alleged plot to derail the train bearing King Victor Emmanuel to Berlin.
