Reply to "Appeal to Farmers."

To the Editor of Carleton Sentinel:
Woodstock, March 5, 1902.

We notice, in your last issue, an article headed "Appeal to Farmers," and will say a few words in reply. We regret exceedingly that the writer of that article had not the courage to sign his name, so that we could better judge of his motives. We are loth to believe that any farmer in the County of Carleton would deliberately try to ruin the business of any legitimate company, much less one managed by a brother farmer.

We cannot think the writer of that appeal realized that if the farmers, to whom he writes, believed that article and acted upon it, the Creamery Co. would be ruined, and the business crushed out of existence for all time. We do not believe, as appears on the face of it, that the writer meant to show venom, or spite, or hatred, toward the company, but rather was led by his feelings, and misapprehension of the facts, to overdraw the case, and say things which to some might seem like a malicious desire to injure the company and bankrupt their business.

To take some of the statements made: He says he received 16c for butter fat in June. If he is a patron of the company he knows he was paid 17c; again the statement that 80 lbs of butter fat will make 100 lbs of butter, this is an error. The Creamery butter we make for the English market, takes 90 lbs, a difference of 10 lbs of fat in 100 pounds. The charge of 1c for hauling milk may give the impression that the company charge patrons for hauling, but he knows that would be false, for the company never received one cent from any patron for any such service. The item about butter milk value is just five times the price it is sold for, while he omits to say that all patrons who bring their milk to the Creamery receive their butter milk back and are welcome to it. The skim milk, which in his Sussex calculations is rightly valued at 15c a hundred pounds, is rated at "worse than none."

His calculation makes the butter net the farmer 10 and four-fifths cts per pound, but later he intimates that if the farmers could get 20c, (4c more than he says he received) a pound for the fat, they would be well satisfied.

This would show that 14 and four-fifths cents a pound would be perfectly satisfactory, which, of course, he don't mean. I think this will show the extreme methods of calculation. But, as we said above, we do not believe there was a desire to really injure the company, and making allowance for extravagant methods of making out an extreme case; let us for a moment look at the case as it is:—

The Carleton Creamery Co. was organized and is now managed by a practical farmer, who has sent the milk of ten cows during the past two seasons. The company started under great disadvantages and has made a heroic struggle to maintain its existence. Its manager has great faith in its ultimate success, for he relies on the intelligent co-operation of the dairy farmers of our county, and believes in the future growth of the dairy interests. During the past three years the company have bought, of the farmers, nearly eight and a half million pounds of milk, paying them in checks in the bank \$59,757, besides all the wood, ice, wages, and other expenses amounting to thousands of dollars. Most of the butter made has been sent to England and good English gold returned to be distributed as above. One hundred and twenty thousand pounds of butter sent from this small county, over the Atlantic, has increased the price of butter, in not only Woodstock, but St. John as well. This has been a great help to butter makers in marketing their products. Should this business close up, and this quantity of butter be dumped on the market the coming season, where would the price go to? If it is to the interest of the farmer to find an outlet for his produce, one that will bring him in quick returns in bank checks to the tune of \$20,000 or so per year for butter alone, is it wise to rush into print, and try to kill the very means which is accomplishing this end? Would it not be better for the "practical, intelligent, pushing farmer," to consult with the Creamery Co. and see what could be done to increase the business and make it a greater benefit to the county than it is.

If you will allow us, in another issue of your paper, we will take up the Sussex Creamery business and make a fair comparison between that and ours and see wherein we may improve our methods.

Of one thing we may be sure, the success of the dairy interest of our county demands that the patrons and the company work in harmony, and have a much better understanding than heretofore. If one hundred or less of our best practical farmers

would take shares with the ones who are now working the business up, put from \$20 to \$500 each into the business, it would give a new impetus to the business, and they would enjoy a share of the great profit the company are supposed to be making. The company will be pleased with any fair criticism, and courts the fullest investigation, and will be pleased to give full information to those who are interested in the dairy business of this county.

We wish to be frank and meet our patrons in the most friendly way, for we fully believe that until our patrons can make a fair profit there is little chance for the success of—

THE RIGHT TO VOTE.

There are many full fledged English citizens who are disqualified from membership in parliament and from taking any part in parliamentary elections. Thus all peers of the realm, except those Irish peers who do not happen to have been elected for life to represent their order in the house of lords, are barred from the exercise of franchise. So, too, are police officials, high and low. They neither have a vote nor are they eligible.

Ineligibility to parliament extends to the Anglican clergy, to Scottish Presbyterian ministers and to the Roman Catholic priesthood. Undischarged bankrupts and those convicted of felony and who have not completed their sentences and are merely freed on tickets of leave are likewise disqualified from election to parliament. So, too, are young men under the age of twenty-one, and persons who having been judiciously declared insane, have not


