
LARGEST AND BEST SALE OF JERSEYS IN THIS COUNTRY FOR YEARS.

The recent auction sale at Hood Farm, Lowell, Mass., dispersed 154 farmers all over the country from Maine to Oregon, it being the largest and most successful sale of American-bred Jersey breeders in this country for years. There was an attendance of over 500, there being 58 different buyers, comprising the best known Jersey breeders in the country. The sale was conducted by Peter C. Kellogg of New York.

The 48 cows sold brought \$9165, an average of \$190, 67 heifers and calves sold for \$5890, and 39 bulls and bull calves brought \$2895. Thirty head by the great show bull Hood Farm Pogis sold for \$3810; 19 by Torono for \$2907; 8 by Sophie's Tormentor for \$2296, an average of \$287; 8 by Brown Bessie's Son, \$1200 and 8 by Chromo, \$824.
