General News Items.

The Provincial Elections in Ontario
will take place on May 29th.

It is announced that the fund for the
National Memorial of Queen Victoria
now amounts to £191,730.

Near Scarborough, Eng., there is a
farm for raising butterflies and
moths. The output is 20,000 a sea-
son.

It is now said that Cecil Rhodes
left \$25,000,000, ten million of which
are to be used in the advancement
of education. A cousin George
Rhodes, living at Lakewood, N. J.,
received \$50,000 as his share.

The Prince of Wales has all these
titles: Great Steward of Scotland,
Duke of Rothesay, Duke of Cornwall,
Earl of Chester, Earl of Dublin,
Duke of Saxony, and Lord of the
Isles.

Italy, Roumania, Servia, and
Greece are the European countries
where men outnumber women.
Greece has 113 men to 100 women.

A colony of Mennonites from the
State of Nebraska will settle on a
