ST. JOHN LETTER.

"It is the patient man who wins," says Elbert Hubbard. "To do your work and not be anxious about results, is wisdom of the highest order." Patient men shine in history all the way from the days of Job to our own day; some of them who are conspicuous among our contemporaries are Edison, Fista, Marconi, Peary and Kitchener. Peary has not reached the pole, but he has accomplished much in the interest of science, and Kitchener has not vanquished the invaders of Britain's colonies in South Africa, but he has preserved them to the nation. Another patient man is Elbert Hubbard, before referred to, who has built up at East Aurora, N. Y., one of the most notable book publishing establishments in the United States, employing some 500 operatives, which was founded a few years ago in a stable, and worked by himself and a boy. Still another patient man is Rev. L. A. Funk, of McKeesport, Pa., who less than a year ago dug the trenches for the foundations, and built, chiefly, the walls of a \$150,000 church which is nearing completion. Funds were scarce, so Mr. Funk went to work with his own hands; the next Sunday his congregation subscribed \$4000 towards a building fund. Mr. Funk continued to work six days every week and preach every Sunday, the funds coming in as fast as wanted, until he was disabled by an accident. Then his wife preached every Sunday until he was able to resume his work. The church will be completed early in the Spring and will not be burdened with a mortgage. "It is the patient man who wins."

DOERS FAILED THIS TIME.

London, Feb. 27.—The attack made by the Boers, numbering 600, and driving cattle before them to rush the outpost line near Bothasberg, Transvaal Colony, during the night of Feb. 23, was most determined. They were led by two well known fighters, Ross Hlands and Manie Botha. When the Boers realized that their attempt to actually break through the wire fences was frustrated they crouched beside the dead cattle with which the ground was thickly strewn and from that defence poured a heavy fire on the British troops. The fusillade was steadily returned and finally the Boers were driven back, leaving fifteen dead and six wounded on the field. They also left 170 dead or wounded horses and the entire herd of six thousand head of cattle.

FARMERS' INSTITUTE WORK.

Mr. Simpson Rennie, of Toronto, in speaking of his recent trip through New Brunswick in connection with the Farmer Institute work of that Province, says that the meetings were generally well attended, and a lively interest taken in the discussions. Mr. Rennie attended the Nova Scotia Dairymen meeting at Amherst, on the 23rd, 24th, and 25th. of January, and the meeting of the New Brunswick Farmers and Dairymen Association at Fredericton, on the 28th, 29th, and 30th, delivering addresses on the "Cultivation of Corn, Field Roots, and Potatoes," and "The requirements of the Beef markets." At both these meetings, the delegates and others present, appeared to take a great interest in the proceedings. "Judging from what I could see when travelling through the country," continued Mr. Rennie, "Very much more should be done in the breeding and feeding of both cattle and hogs, but before very much is done, a better class of animals should be introduced. Sheep raising should be more extensively gone into, especially where the land is dry and rolling. Dairying is carried on somewhat extensively and with fair success, but in some localities the isolated condition of the patrons is found to be a great drawback to the industry. From my observations, thousands of acres of land are only yielding small returns for want of underdraining but when these things are better understood, considering the intelligence of the people, we may look for great things in the near future.

Effect of Lord Dufferin's Mission.

Lord Dufferin's mission to Canada was distinguished by the inculcation of respect and admiration for Canada by Canadians. His Excellency fitted the public mind with an idea of this country both as to its present greatness and to its splendid future that until his arrival had not been entertained. Along with this valuable leadership, Canada received from him a new view of the Imperial relations. He showed that servility and independence were not our part in the union, but, on the contrary, we were destined to be an independent associate nation, claiming and enjoying equal rights with other British communities. Lord Dufferin spent six and a half years with us and travelled Canada from end to end, delighting the people with his genius and inspiring them by his oratory. His farewell speech was delivered at the Industrial Exhibition grounds in Toronto, on Sept. 24, 1878. The parting words were a consideration of the duty of Canadians to their heritage. "Love your country, he said; believe in her, honor her, work for her, live for her, die for her. On October 19th he sailed from Quebec and a brilliant page in our history was closed.
