BOOTS AND TEETH OF PAPER

Paper teeth would appear to many people at first sight quite impracticable and useless, yet actual use has proved them to be in every respect equal to those made of porcelain or other similar compositions. Dentists in this country and in Germany are now making them prominent in their work, and in every case they are said to give satisfaction. Naturally, too, they are very much less expensive than the false teeth used hitherto, while they cannot break so easily, and are not in the least susceptible to conditions of temperature.

Another queer and interesting use modern ingenuity has found for paper is to manufacture footgear from it. So skillfully can it be prepared for the purpose that in appearance it is almost identical with that of patent leather. It is, however, considerably lighter, and so thin that it apparently reduces the wearer's feet a couple of sizes or more—a fact which will doubtless go a good way toward bringing paper shoes into popular use, for most people have an inward and secret desire to possess small feet. Such shoes are best suited for housewears, more especially through their fragility rendering them hardly durable enough for outdoor wear.

CROPS AND PROSPERITY.

According to the monthly crop report, issued by the Washington government last week, the harvest of all grains this year, with the exception of spring and winter wheat, will be larger than last season. The wheat harvest totals 380,000,000 bushels, being 137,849,218 less than last year, but this is not considered an abnormal decrease, because the yield this year has only been exceeded twice in former years. On the other hand, the corn crop is in excess of last harvest, 972,561,109 bushels. Oats, barley, rye and buckwheat have all advanced in proportion, so that on the whole this has been a prosperous year for the farmers of the United States. As foreign credits depend on the character of the harvest the general effect of this good showing is apparent, and trade journals are making the best of it, although they have been claiming all along that the prosperity of the country depends on the protective tariff. The same reasoning applies to this country, and the fact that in every country of Europe the harvest has been adversely affected by bad weather means that the demand abroad will be heavier than usual, which will tend to maintain prices, so that for North America at least another prosperous year would seem to be assured.

Mr. W. E. Mason, of the Canada Permanent and Western Mortgage Company, returned Thursday, after ten days of exciting moose hunting, in company with Drs. J. and George Ryan, of Paris, France, and Rev. W. W. Lodge. Mr. Mason shot a 1,400 pound moose as it charged him, thirty miles northeast of Grand Falls, Victoria county. The head is the finest brought into St. John this season. The antlers are particularly handsome. They are 55 inches across with 13 prongs on one side and 12 on the other.—Exchange.

London, Oct. 3.—A contract to the value of \$2,500,000 has been awarded to an American company for the equipment of two generating stations in the Clyde Valley, intended to supply electric power for industrial purposes over an area of 750 square miles.

Quebec, Oct. 2.—The scarcity of coal in this city will, it is said, oblige several large establishments to close down for the winter. The small lot of anthracite on hand is selling at \$15 a ton.

Last year the United States paid out \$137,504,238 in pensions to soldiers and widows and dependents.

In New York City there are less than 2,000 tons of coal on hand. The prices are \$25 a ton and 75 cents a bushel.
