General News Items.

The German subscription for the Boer funds totalled \$75,000.

The election petition in Lisgar was dismissed Thursday and the decision confirms Stewart, Liberal, in his seat.

The entire coffee zone of Guatemala has been destroyed by flames and smoke from the volcano of Santa Maria.

Glanders is rapidly spreading among the horses in Ottawa. A number of horses had to be killed last week.

A fifty foot block of land in Winnipeg, immediately south of the Dominion Bank, sold on Saturday last for \$1,500 a foot.

George H. Harvey, a well-known citizen of Augusta, was shot by a companion while out hunting, being mistaken for a deer.

A number of the former Boer commandants and British officers have offered their services and those of one thousand men, half of whom are British and half Boer soldiers, for in Somaliland.

Moustaches are not worn by men exposed to the severity of an Alaskan winter. They wear full beards to protect the throat and face, but keep the upper lip clean shaven. The moisture from the breath congeals so quickly that a moustache becomes embedded in a solid cake of ice, and the face is frozen in a short time.
