Ottawa, Dec. 18.-The Hon. John Costigan, M. P., says that he will invite the Canadian Parliament, at its forthcoming session, once more to express its sympathy with the Irish cause in a resolution to be forwarded to the Imperial authorities in

"This will not be a new matter to the Canadian Commons," remarked Mr Costigan, 'in fact, it is a very old question on which our national assembly has already more than once expressed its conviction. My resolution will not differ materially from that which has secured endorsation in previous sessions, only we judge it wise that the men who represent the Canadian public at Ottawa purchased the store and stock of L.
