ROOTS FOR SWINE.

During the last two or three years a great deal of interest has been taken in the subject of feeding roots to swine. Formerly a prejudice existed against them on account of an idea that their use was responsible sons of the year. Careful experiment has shown, however, that roots can be fed in moderate quantities combined with other feed without cerned becomes of considerable importance to our farmers.

PROPORTION OF ROOTS TO GRAIN. The experiments conducted by Prof. Day, and Prof. Grisdale and myself, as well as the experience of many of our best farmers indicate that the most economical and satisfactory ration for swine feeding contains equal parts by weight of grain and roots. The addition of about 3 ths. per day of skim milk or whey will go far to insure thrifty growth and fine quality of pork.

Report of Emigration.

Ottawa, Jan. 22 .- According to returns compiled by the British Bureau of Labor and Statistics, 26,407 persons of British origin emigrated to Canada during the year 1902, as compared with 15,757 in 1901. 108,501 left British ports last year for the United States. Those of Irish origin numbered 37,885, as compared with 1,498 who landed in Canada. Of English 58,390 landed in the United States and 21,094 in Canada; and 12,226 Scotch landed in the United States, weak and helpless and suffering from theu-matism. 


