'Oh, we have no doubt it pays us,' said he. 'We have been advertising for a good many years, and while we have never had any direct evidence that our advertising brought any results still we have faith in its value, and feel that it does us some good.'

There was a man who had too much faith. He felt satisfied that the advertising he was doing was beneficial to his business, and when he didn't get any direct results from his ads. it didn't trouble him much-he didn't

worry about it as some do. Advertising that doesn't bring results is not good advertising. If you cannot see that you are getting direct returns from the advertising that you are doing, you had better look for the reason and change your methods.
