EDITORIAL NOTES.

The whole empire hears with sorrow the news of Lord Kitchener's accident.

Hon. Chas. Wilson, the new attorney general of British Columbia, was elected in Vancouver on Wednesday by nearly one thousand majority.

The Fredericton Herald notices the apology for Mr. Tarte in this week's Press. The Herald wonders what the local Tories will do with that "Tarte the Traitor" motto.

The vacant collectorship at St. John is one of the best plums in the gift of the federal government. Rumor has it that Surveyor General Dunn is likely to have the refusal of the position. In the event of his acceptance, the vacancy in the local administration would probably be filled by the elevation of Mr. W. P. Jones to a seat in the executive.

The German Emperor is fast recovering from the effects of the recent operation performed upon him for the removal of a polypus from the throat. There is some apprehension that the trouble may be more serious than is admitted by his physicians. The Hohenzollern family is subject to cancer; both parents of the Emperor having fallen victims to the malady.

Hon. George E. Foster is addressing large gatherings in the Old Country in support of the Chamberlain crusade for higher duties. The Hon. George seems to be a popular orator across the sea, and may be offered a seat in parliament. If such should be the case we trust better luck will accompany his venture than when he last essayed to secure a seat in a representative body.

There is great need for a convention of newspapermen to fix a scale of rates which will protect the publisher. In this province the rates are, we fear, altogether too low. If there were some arrangements entered into, by which the agencies would be unable to play one paper against another, rates would certainly go up. Who will take the initiative and call a meeting for the purpose of organization?

BARRED OUT.

It appears that if anyone is so unfortunate as to be an undergraduate of the University of New Brunswick, he cannot attend the opening exercises of the Normal School. Fredericton papers convey the impression that the principal of the school will not allow University Students this privilege, probably on account of some actions cut up by a few college men. We cannot see that the whole undergraduate body should be shut out on account of the crimes of a few. If we were a student and wished to witness the opening exercises, someone would pay dearly for his interference, if it were attempted.

POLITICAL RUMORS.

There is some talk of a dissolution of parliament in the near future. The Cabinet met this week and considered the matter, but nothing official has been given out.

It is quite likely that the Cabinet vacancy will be filled early next week by the appointment of Hon. H. R. Emmerson.
