### Another Tory Confession.

The St. John Sun, the leading Tory organ of New Brunswick, has naively and quite unintentionally placed itself on record as being of the opinion that its party stands no chance of winning in the coming general elections in the Dominion.

The Moncton Transcript in pointing out the fact says that the Sun will, of course, wriggle and deny it, but such is the logical interpretation of its language and arguments.

In enumerating the number of vacant seats in the House of Commons, and also the seats vacated by prospective appointments, the Sun refers to the Senate vacancies, and concludes by saying, "It is not unlikely that these Senatorships will be reserved for the consolation of defeated candidates in the impending elections."

"The impending elections," of which the Sun is speaking, says the Transcript, are the general elections but in the light of Lord Aberdeen's ruling, after the defeat of the Tupper Administration in 1896, a defeated Government cannot make nominations to the Senate; and, therefore the Sun admits that the Laurier Government will be sustained at the polls, because if it is not sustained at the polls, it could not do that which the Sun says, it will do. The Sun is correct for once; the Laurier Government will continue to fill Senate vacancies after the general elections.—Chronicle.

### Murders in British and American Cities.

Recently many comparisons and contrasts have been made between the state of things in British and American cities—particularly between London and New York—and the result has invariably been to the discredit of the latter. Hitherto attention has not been particularly directed to the murders committed in them respectively. There are more murders committed in New York City in a single month than in London in a whole year, though the latter has about double the population. A contemporary says:—

"Within the metropolitan police district of London, which comprises 688 square miles and has a population of 6,500,000, there were committed last year only twenty murders. In four cases the murderers committed suicide. In all the others the murderers were discovered and arrested by the police. Thirteen of them were tried by the Courts within the same year, and nine of them were hanged and four were adjudged insane. What disposition was made of the other three is not stated." No American large city can show so good a record. Here, too, it is rather rare that the perpetrator of a murder is discovered and punished, but in London last year all the murderers were arrested, tried, and promptly punished. And yet the London police only number 14,476, officers and men, with an annual pay of seven million dollars (\$7,000,000). But then the London police are not under the heel of Tammany, nor in any way mixed up in politics.

For forging a priest's name to an application for help out of the Lord-Lieutenant's Almoners' Fund, a woman has been sent to prison for a month in Dublin.
