THE HAY BONUS.

The Imperial Packing Co. are taking steps necessary to the securing of the \$5000 bonus from the town. The law requires an investment of \$20,000 on the part of the company before the \$5000 can be granted.

A committee of the whole council met on Wednesday and went over the books of the company with Mr. Hay. It is claimed that the present plan represents an investment of over \$25,000. A special meeting of the council will probably be called at an early date to take the steps necessary before payment is made.

Resolution of Sympathy.

At a meeting of Christ's Church Corporation on Tuesday evening it was decided unanimously to provide for a curate to assist Archdeacon Neales in the parish. The following resolution, on motion of William Dibblee, seconded by David Hipwell, was unanimously passed:—

The church wardens and vestry of Christ's Church here assembled take the opportunity of expressing to their beloved rector their regret at his recent illness, from which they now rejoice to hear he is in a good measure recovering. They feel that his illness was brought on by the devoted attention the rector has always given to the affairs of the parish and the adjoining missions, and they express the hope that for the future he will be furnished with such assistance as will render his conduct of the spiritual affairs under his control less onerous than in the past.
