RECIPES.

PINEAPPLE MARMALADE.

Six pineapples, five lbs. sugar, 2 lemons. Cut up fine over night and boil next morning until tender; put in air-tight jars.

WALNUT WAFERS.

One cup brown sugar, two eggs beaten lightly, half cup flour, one cup broken walnuts, quarter teaspoon salt. Spread thinly on buttered sheet; cut in squares while hot.

ONION SCALLOP.

Peel twelve good sized onions, boil one hour, drain and cut into small pieces; put a layer on bottom of dish spread over them a layer of crumbs, then a sprinkling of grated cheese and bits of butter, then another layer and so on until dish is full—crumbs on top—and add one cup of cream (milk will do). Bake in a moderate oven one hour.

BAKED BANANAS.

Remove skins from six bananas and cut in halves lengthwise; put in a shallow granite pan or on an old platter (do not use tin); mix two tablespoons melted butter, one-third cup sugar, and two tablespoons lemon juice. Baste bananas with one-half the mixture. Bake twenty minutes in a slow oven, basting during baking with remaining mixture.

GREEN PEA SOUP.

One can green peas, two teaspoons sugar, one pint cold water, one pint milk, one slice onion, two tablespoons butter, two tablespoons flour, one teaspoonful salt, one-eighth teaspoon pepper. Drain peas from their liquor, add sugar and cold water, and simmer twenty minutes; rub through a sieve, reheat, and thicken with butter and flour cooked together; scald milk with onion, remove onion, add milk to pea mixture, season with salt and pepper. Peas too old to serve as a vegetable may be utilized for soups.

CHOCOLATE CAKE.

One and a half cups sugar, half cup butter, half cup milk, one and three-quarter cups flour, quarter pound grated chocolate, three eggs, one teaspoonful cream tartar, half teaspoonful soda. To the grated chocolate add five tablespoonsful of sugar (this in addition to the cup and a half), three tablespoonsful boiling water and stir over fire until smooth and glossy, then stir it into the butter and sugar which have already been creamed and mixed, add eggs well beaten, then the milk and flour in which the soda and cream of tartar have been thoroughly mixed. Bake twenty minutes in a moderate oven.

WOMEN SAINTS.

Women have succeeded better in painting than in novel-writing. Madame Morizot made an exquisite and beautiful adaption of the art of Manet; she carried the art of Manet across her fan, and in doing so she invented an art for herself, and her paintings will always delight those who can appreciate good painting. But when women try to think or to construct, their literature becomes sexless, it becomes non-descript, and one does not know whether to compare Daniel Deronda to an ox or a mule. The delicious and exquisite sex is not notable for philosophers or for artists but for queens and courtesans. It is said that women have succeeded as queens. I am not a historian and cannot argue that point.
