Surtax on German Goods.

Berlin, April 22.—The German Govrnment, before corresponding with Great Britain regarding the surtax imposed by Canada on German goods, or suggesting to the Bundesrath that the retaliatory measures provided for in the new tariff bill should be applied, intends to enquire afresh through the Ministry of the Interior as to what the precise trade exchanges between Germany and Canada are, and how far German exports would be affected were the other British colonies to similarly discriminate against Germany. The Foreign Office apparently considers the principle involved to be one of exceeding importance, extending far beyond what are regarded as the rather insignificant interests directly engaged.

The Colossus of Rhodes, a bronze statue, was 105 feet high. It was made by Charles, who, aided by an army of workmen, consumed twelve years in its construction. It remained in position in the harbor of Rhodes for sixty-six years and was thrown down by an earthquake B. C. 224. It lay on the ground 894 years and was sold to a Jew for old metal. He carried away 900 camel loads, or about 720,000 pounds of bronze.
