Report of South African War Commission.

Next to the Macedonian trouble and Preferential Tariffs the report of the Royal Commission on the South African War continues to be the great subject of discussion among all classes in Britain. They have now calmed down a little, and while some perceive nothing in the report except a general candemnation of every member of the Government, excepting only Colonial Secretary Chamberlain, others are disposed to see some redeeming features. They say the War Office showed lots of faults, but it also showed some strength and vigour. Generals of the conscription-raised armies of Europe said it could not raise two army corps for foreign service. It raised six, and sent or created in South Africa in two years and a half a force of 448,000 men, who were clothed, fed and cared for as such an army never was before in all Great Britain's wars.

Though the English had claimed the territory a centry and a half before, the final occupation of British Guiana took place in 1803. The centenary of the event is to be celebrated this month in Georgetown.
