Continued from second page.) the best proofs of the prosperity of the province is to be found in the increase of its agricultural exports. The exports of butter and cheese for last year reached a value of \$341,000. This butter and cheese was the product of 40 butter factories and 55 cheese factories, all of which had been assisted by the provincial government. Dairying is an industry that ought to be encouraged. In 1897 this province exported no butter whatever. Last year we exported \$88,000 worth. All this had beneficial effect on the manufacturing of butter

for domestic use. 'The government has established 21 roller mills for the grinding of wheat, and last year 453,000 bushels of wheat were grown. That was also a benefit to the province.

'I am glad that his honor was able to speak favorably of the mineral development of the province. I believe that there is a great future for our minerals. 
