OLD BATTLES REMOVED.

In view of the near approach of a federal election, our readers may be interested in perusing the following summary of political events during the past dozen years.

The beginning of the end of Conservative rule came with the death of Sir John Macdonald June 6, 1891. Sir John Abbott was called upon to form an administration June 16, 1891, and on Dec. 5, 1892 he resigned owing to ill-health. He was succeeded by Sir John Thompson Dec. 1892. About this time the Manitoba school question began to loom upon the horizon. Putting constitutional matters aside, this was a question whether Roman Catholic Separate schools should or should not be allowed in Manitoba. It was said that Sir John Thompson, who was a Roman Catholic, an omniscient jurist had an extremely able and moderate man, and decided upon a plan of settling this question. But his early, sudden and tragic death Dec. 12, 1894, at Windsor Castle, left the government again without a head until the calling of Sir Mackenzie Bowell on Dec. 21, 1894.

Sir Mackenzie, a plucky and honest statesman, inherited among other difficulties the Manitoba school question. About the end of 1895 N. Clarke Wallace, member for West York and controller of customs, resigned because he could not support a policy leading to the restoration of Separate schools in Manitoba. About this time the government lost some by elections, and was generally considered to be in a dangerous state. On Jan. 4, 1896, seven members of the cabinet resigned. The "bolt," as it was called, was generally regarded as foreshadowing the defeat that occurred some six months later. How far it was a symptom of weakness, how far it caused or assisted in the collapse, must remain a disputed question. The man on the street simply said that it was "the beginning of the end." The government had in the Manitoba school case a question of tremendous difficulty to handle and this may have been the real wedge. But there were various other questions, largely of a personal character. In giving his explanation in the House Mr. Foster clearly pointed to a change in leadership. These who went out of office were Hon. George E. Foster, Hon. John Haggart, Hon. W. H. Montague, Hon. J. F. Wood, Hon. A. R. Dickey, Sir Charles H. Tupper and Hon. W. B. Ives. The "bolters," however, all came back except Sir C. H. Tupper.

All this time there remained in the background Sir Charles Tupper, a father of Confederation and the right hand man of Sir John A. Macdonald. He had taken the post of High Commissioner of England, and but for his absence would have succeeded his old chief. When the "bolt" came he was recalled from England and was appointed Secretary of State and leader of the House of Commons in the reconstructed administration. The reconstruction was soon followed by the resignation of Sir Mackenzie Bowell and Sir Charles Tupper formed a new cabinet May 1. An appeal to the country was made on June 23. The Liberals declared for a lower tariff, but the main issue was the Remedial Bill and Sir Charles found himself in a minority. The vote by provinces was:

The Laurier government made its second appeal Nov 7, 1900. The tariff and the South African war were the principal issues. The result:

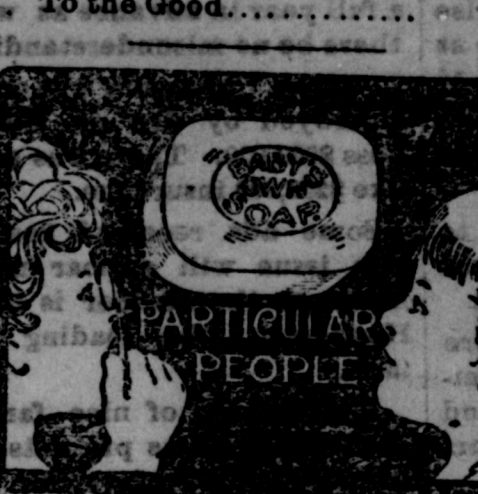
