DRINK AND CHILD LIFE.

Of late there has been considerable mortality among infants, a fact which has led the medical officers of health in several towns to issue hints to mothers on the management of children. The bearing of drink upon infant mortality, and also upon the health of the nursing mother, is dealt with. Dr Niven, of Manchester in his circular says: The mother should partake only of plain and wholesome food, avoiding intoxicating drinks such as spirits and beer." The Dundee town council in their circular, say: "All kinds of spirits should be avoided." The medical officer of health for Eccles, says: "The mother must avoid absolutely alcoholic stimulants." When the medical officers of health are, in their official documents, enforcing this lesson, the temperance reformer may take courage and press forward in the work of further enlightening the people.

Temperance Missionary Society, New York State.

Rev Dr F C Englehart, who was chairman of a committee appointed by the various evangelical churches and temperance societies to visit Albany and protest against the efforts to greatly liberalize the liquor law so as to give more license to the vile traffic, made an address in which he discussed the assertion that the saloon was the poor man's club, to which he could go as the rich man goes to his club. He asserted that the saloon was a club that knocks him down, robs him of his earnings, his strength and his reason, beats and strikes down wife and children, and such a club should be taken away. He asserted that no administration could be beaten by enforcing the law, as Mr Roosevelt had in one day closed 8,000 saloons, and because of his courage in doing so some 30,000 Democrats had voted for him for Governor.

It is quite possible there are some so ignorant of facts that they imagine they are "cutting ice" for the cause of temperance by talking Government Control, but they only need to investigate to find that they are really "excavating fog." Better far better, "saw wood" in the good old way.

It is not at all strange that the ministers of the Gospel here in Canada who are willing to endorse Government Control, do not refer us to the endorsement of this system of liquor selling by brother ministers in South Carolina and Georgia, for the simple reason that the reputable minister of the Gospel, who after observing the "inner workings" of this system would endorse it as a deterrent to the traffic—much less a temperance measure—has not yet been ordained.

The man willing to make his living by selling liquor has long been a social outcast to good society. He has been almost unanimously, "black-balled by fraternal organizations and by the dispassionate standard of British justice in Ontario, adjudged unfit to serve his fellows as a municipal officer. By the crown he has been challenged and disqualified by his occupation to act as a jurymen. Then what would our Government be like after a course in the capacity of Provincial bartenders, or what would be the effect on our fair province to have its very Government existing and maintaining office by and through the amount of liquor it could dispense to the degradation and damnation of its subjects.
