Annual Meeting of Woodstock W. C. T. U.

The annual meeting of the Woodstock W. C. T. U. was held last Thursday in Young's Hall.

The following officers were elected for the next year: Mrs Jordan, president; Mrs John Hillman, rec secretary; Mrs J D Dickinson; treasurer; Mrs G W Slipp, cor secretary.

The treasurer's report shows the Union in good standing financially. After the years expenses are paid there is a balance in the treasury, also a bank account of nearly \$300. The W. C. T. U. is to-day the only Temperance organization in our town. Have we any need of temperance sentiment or work in our town? Is there any need of uneasiness on the part of parents when our young boys get out into the streets?

Where did the young men we saw on our Main street Sunday night as we came from church, reeling, get the intoxicating drink? Is no one interested? How anxious we women of the different churches of our town are about the heathen getting saved in our mission societies, and while we are sending missionaries to evangelize the heathen, is it not possible we are overlooking a portion of our duty by neglecting those at our very threshold. "These (foreign missions) ought ye to have done, but not to have left the other undone." Our W. C. T. U motto is "for God and home and every land", and our work begins in the home. Between the home set up in Eden and the home before us in Eternity stand the homes of earth in a long succession, where souls and bodies are nourished, where fortunes are built and brains are trained, there must be a focus of all moral and physical interest. How then shall the home fulfil the great duty lying before it?

How shall we preserve health and happiness, eradicate evils and train our children for lives of usefulness? The first duty is to teach our children obedience in the home to the powers that rule there, their obedience to teachers in our day and Sunday schools will naturally follow and later on obedience to the laws of the nation and God will be secured. The W. C. T. U has many departments of work, with at present but few workers, but though small in numbers we do not feel discouraged for we are on the side that is sure to win, for truth and righteousness will finally vanquish error, and the good will triumph over the bad.

We have benevolent work, jail and prison work among sailors, railway work, peace and arbitration, work for lumbermen, mercy department, health and heredity, world's missions, evangelistic and scientific temperance in schools, etc. This department is a most important one. Our children are taught the effects of alcohol and narcotics on the system. This is the foundation department of temperance work and should be taught very carefully as the hope of our nation is with the youth of our land to-day in our schools. What does all the educational advantages given our children in schools, colleges and institutions of learning amount to if they are to be overcome with the drink habit. Total abstinence has been and is still the backbone of reform, intelligent convictions as to the drink itself and its effects on the human system is indispensable, if public opinion is to be made strong and reliable. Realizing as we do to-day the urgent need of more workers in this cause, of more interest and aggressive work, we would appeal to the mothers and sisters of our town for active co-operation along these lines of work, for help in extending these principles of right in our midst. All have not the same gifts. The departments of work are varied and will apply to all whether the two talents, or the five, or the one. Let us be more earnest in the coming year in putting down the giant evils and pray that all forms of sin and iniquity may be vanquished from our town.

During last year the Post Office delivered 4,300,000 packets in the United Kingdom.
