





FIRST PIANO MAKER.

It was a harpsichord maker, Cristofori, in the employ of the Duke of Tuscany, who in 1711 made the first successful piano. As curator of Ferdinand de Medici he had a splendid collection of Belgian, sympathizer in our warfare against French and Italian instruments to look after, and this undoubtedly aided him, though the model was so crude that the inventor could never have dreamed a monument would ever be erected in his memory. There are only two grand piano-


fortes of Cristofori in existence. One decorated in gold and Chinese great Christian denominations in our Three documents attest the authenticity of this tast instrument, which was purchased from Signor Diego Martelli.

> From this feeble beginning a long list of names could be mentioned of men who helped perfect the piano. Rut factories alone could never have achieved without loyalty to encourage and virtuosos to play. Frederick the Great ordered five pianos for his palace, where they can be seen at the present day. Marie Antoinette was a patron of the art, and Clementi in England and Mozart in Germany introduced the instruments, so it became a part of life. It was in Pleyel's concert room that Chopin played, and our later firms have brought out a long list of artists-Joseffy, Paderewski and others.




