Fight to Win Back \$68,000 Lost in a Faro Game.

New York, Dec. 3) .- Inspector of police McClusky has been notified that two men who lost \$35,000 a few nights ago in a gumbling house in Forty-sixth street, to which they had been piloted from the Waldorf Astoria by Carl Van Vort, decided the next day that they had been playing against crooked faro bank and roulette. With the assistance of the hotel detective and two central office detectives they got back \$44,000 in checks, which they had drawn for part of their losses, but did not suceed in getting back \$24,coo in cash. One of the men, Mr. Davis, is from Cleveland, and is a millionaire, and the other is from Pitteburg.

It was declared last night that the Pittsburg man was a relative of Andrew Carnegie.

According to the police the play that night was first at faro, where the limit on case cards was fixed at \$500. Nothing lower than \$20 chips in stacks of \$500 were bought at a time. The action was not quick enough at faro to suit Davis, who had \$10,000, and his suggestion that hey go to the roulette table was seconded by the Cleveland man, who had dropped about \$5,000.

At roulette the limit was fixed at \$500 on colors or odd and even and \$50 on a single number. At roulette Davis lost \$6,000 in cash and the Pittsburger trailed with a loss of \$3.000.




