Houlton Water Works.

The pumping station is a 2 1/2 story building built of brick 43x50; part of it is used for electric lighting, and part for the pumping engines, there are three pumps, one is a condensing duplex with steam cylinders 10 ft 18 1/2 in diameter capable of delivering 700 gallons per minute. The two other pumps are duplex high pressure with steam cylinders 14 ft in diameter; each has a capacity of 500,000 gallons in 24 hours. There are three boilers, two horizontal tubular boilers 50 H. P. each, the other boiler is a Babcock and Wilcox water tube boiler; this is 100 H. P.

The electric light consists of one improved Greene engine with cylinders 12x33 feet, 125 H. P. One 2,000 light alternator and exciter and one arc light dynamo; there are besides the machines, two Boyle feed pumps and one Dean condenser, two feed water heaters.

The company has just finished unloading 800 tons of coal which is their year's supply of coal. They take their water from the Meduxnakeag river; it passes through a filter into a large well and then taken from the well by the pumps. The town of Houlton uses about 300,000 gallons per day, that is the city water, it is as good as any in the country. When the town gets the new reservoir finished they will have one of the best water supplies in the country. The engineer in charge has been with the company 18 years and the assistant engineer 12 years. It takes three men to look after things, two by night, one by day.
