JAPAN.

News comes from the Island Empire of the East, that the Emperor of Japan is encouraging the temperance movement, and that the many disasters visited by the Japanese navy on the Russian warships are to be accounted for by the fact that the old-time enemy, "drink" had defeated the Russians before they met the Japanese.

A writer in the Buffalo, N. Y. Evening News, who was recently at Port Arthur, says in an interview, in reply to the query:—"What causes Russia's defeats?"

"I think the question may be sufficiently answered by one word—drink. From what I saw and learned I believe that Russian officers in both the army and navy, are as a rule, drunk every night in their lives. A man who is drunk every night can never be entirely sober in the day time, and in what condition is a man whose brain is befuddled with liquor to lead soldiers or command warships?

I was informed while in Port Arthur that one Milwaukee brewery alone, ships 10,000 barrels of beer into Port Arthur, which is a town of only 5,000 population. The beer is of course for Russians in the main. That is the shipment of a single brewery. It may be judged from that what the total amount of beer consumed there must be. But an instance still more to the point is the fact that during the last few years 25,000 cases of champagne have been shipped to Port Arthur every year. This champagne is for the consumption of the officers of the garrison. You take into consideration the amount of whiskey, brandy and cordials which is consumed by as many officers as is required to command 30,000 troops and you see how enormous the consumption of intoxicants of each officer on the average must be.

I was informed by a Frenchman, while at Port Arthur, that on the occasion of a dinner given by the commander of a French warship to the officers of the garrison at Port Arthur, my informant being present at the dinner, that the Russians were partially drunk when the dinner was half over and wholly drunk by the time it was finished.

"What kind of men are these to oppose the sober, capable and alert Japanese? Drunkenness is practically unknown in Japan. When in Tokio I travelled through the worst quarters of the city as well as the best quarters, and even where you would look for dissipation I saw only two Japanese who were at all under the influence of liquor and they were not officers or soldiers of any degree, but civilians. I would not be surprised at anything which befell either the Russian army or navy, knowing as I do the habits of the officers."

The Model (1) Public House and Its Results.

The Daily News recently gave publicity to the following sad incident: A clergyman of the Church of England was addressing a company of more or less unfortunate men in a shelter. He told them that the public-house was not in itself to blame, but that they—the people who resorted thither—ought to know how to use the tavern wisely. The curate was accosted, at the conclusion of his address by a tramp, who bluntly exclaimed, "All that you tell us is a lie." The cleric who was young, resented this language, and asked who his critic considered himself to be. "I am a clergyman of the Church of England," replied the tramp, "who one year ago, was placed in

charge of a Model Public-house. My duties made me what you find me." Here is another proof that the evil of the drink traffic lies in the deceptive and dangerous nature of alcoholic liquors, and that the more respectable the place where they are sold the greater the danger to the community.

Cottage pudding is agreeably varied by the addition of huckleberries. Try this receipt. Butter the size of an egg, one cupful of sugar, one egg, one cupful of milk, two cupfuls of flour, two teaspoonsful of baking powder, one large cupful of berries. Serve hot, for dessert.

Wash the inside of the saucepan with soda, and hot water which has boiled in it. Rinse with first hot and then cold water, and dry thoroughly. It should not retain the odor of cabbage after this.
