The strike at Fall River, Mass., has been in progress fifteen weeks and though the mill owners are still firm on the question of a 12 per cent. reduction in wages, they are inclined to open up the mills and let

those go to work who wish. The loss in wages to the operatives has amounted to nearly \$2,000,000, and families have been reduced to very straitened circumstances.
