Several from here attended the funeral of Mr. Thomas Rideout at East Blaine Wednesday forenoon.

We have the sad privilege of announcing the death of Benjamin K. F. Rideout, which occurred on Sept. 26, 1904, at the age of seventy-nine years.

He was a native of St. Marys, York County, N. B., but had been a resident of Robinson the last four years. His parents were Nathaniel Rideout and Hester Rideout (nee Stewart), both of Majorville, N. B. The deceased was the tenth child in a family of 18.

15 of the children grew to manhood and womanhood. Since his death a brother, Thomas, has died, thus reducing the number to two, Mrs. John Barrett of Wicklow, and John Rideout of Blaine. Benjamin leaves a sorrowing widow and four children, one son, Sylvester, with whom he lived, and three daughters, Mrs. Geo. Hawthorne of Upper Kent, Mrs. Jas. Stewart of Kilburn, and Mrs. George Thompson of Caribou. During the early part of his life Mr. Rideout for 18 years carried on the carriage-making business at Bridgewater.

From thence he moved to Upper Kent where he continued the same business until rheumatism rendered him unable to do so, which was about 20 years ago. For 12 years he has been a confirmed invalid being unable to leave his chair without assistance. He has always borne his sufferings with remarkable patience and Christian fortitude, so he felt no fear in passing through the valley of the shadow of death and rests with the assurance that when Christ

comes to gather his jewels he will receive the reward of everlasting life. He had been a member of the Methodist church for more than 40 years. His funeral services were conducted by Elder Pinkerton, pastor of the M. E. church at Mars Hill. (Fredericton papers please copy.)
