Alsike and Red Clover were obtained from English seed merchants. All these showed a uniform quality, none of them free from weed seeds but had apparently been well cleaned as there was a notable absence of such impurities as light seeds, chaff, or weed seeds either larger or smaller than the bulk of the sample. Small numbers of Cockle, Black Medick, and False Flax still remain in the Alsike, and of Foxtail and Ribgrass in the Red Clover. The germination was uniformly over ninety per cent. The average quality was therefore considerably better than that of the seeds retailed in our own markets. It should always be remembered. however, by buyers that, while the

average quality of our seeds may be low, the highest grades are always offered for sale, and this quality is in the end the most profitable.

Of over two hundred samples of weed seeds were represented. Of these Cinquefoil, Peppergrass, Sheep Sorrel, Ribgrass, False Flax, Lamb's quarters, Canada Thistle and White Cockle were most commonly present, often at the rate of several thousand per pound. In Red Clover and Alsike, of each of which there were several hundred sam ples analysed, there were upwards of forty species of weed seeds, those being commonest whose size approximated that of the clover seed. Thus in Red Clover were commonly found Curled mothers because it contains nothing injurious and there is not the least danger in giving it even to babies.
