The \$3000 whiskey account run up by the Tories is the most shameful thing the county has ever known.

Mr Hale's hired men have been going around the county spellbinding. The people put no stock in them.

The Press, like a genuine know-nothing, claims everything in this province. We have seen and heard such claims before.

The Tory party in the County of Carleton paid \$3600 for the purpose of resurrecting the Press. The money was well worth the goods.

The Toronto News is strongly in favor of the government. All the independent papers are in line. They see and admit government success.

The Press says it knows that Senator Drummond and others we named last issue are not supporting Laurier. The family journal further calls it "a false and slanderous statement." The Press knows nothing about the gentlemen, never even knew they existed until their names were seen in this paper.

The Press, like some other provincial papers, is a four flusher. They were sure Blair would stump for the opposition. The poor Press was easily fooled. If our readers will refresh their memories a bit they will recollect that of all the Tory papers the St. John Sun was least enthusiastic over the fake announcements concerning Mr Blair. He admits he was in British Columbia practically the whole of the last session of parliament, attending to private business, and yet he has the brazen effrontery to ask the people to choose him once more. The Press republishes an apology made by the Liberal News to Mr. Fred Hale. It insinuates that the author of the article to which Mr. Hale took exception, is a resident of Woodstock, and is well known. Here is a case of know nothing once more. The Press in the dirty and treacherous manner of which only a mud slinger is capable, hints that the author is a certain party connected with the "SENTINEL." We have to say that if the Press or any other person will come out plainly and charge the party it is hinting at with being the author of the article, there will be one of the finest libel suits Carleton County has ever seen. ## The Trade of Japan.

It is reported that at the Council held recently at Tokio, it was resolved that Japan should provide the necessary "show" to carry on the war by increasing the charges on foreign commerce. Scarcely fifty years have elapsed since Japan first commenced to trade with the world at large, and it was only six years ago that it first adopted a tariff system, which dates from 1857, and has only been in operation since 1859.

Until 1858 Japan traded only with China, Corea, and, to a limited extent, Portugal and the Netherlands, but in that year it entered into commercial treaties with Great Britain, France, Russia and the United States, and in the year following, 1859, it opened three of its ports to them. In the following decade Japan's foreign trade increased to \$7,313,500 of imports and \$7,774,500 of exports. Since then the growth of its foreign trade has been steady and rapid until last year it reached \$158,557,500 of imports and \$144,751,000 of exports—the most marked increase being within the last nine years, or since the Chinese war.
