### POLITICAL POINTERS.

Carvell and Victory.

Carleton County is in favor of Laurier.

The policy of the liberal party is to rule justly and wisely. The policy of the tory party is to hold office and create scandals. History proves our statement correct.

Electors, are you in favor of building up the St. John Valley? If so vote for Carvell. He is in favor of a new railway down St. John river valley. Hale supports Borden who opposes the valley route.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier has given his personal guarantee, backed by the full weight of the liberal party, that St. John will receive its due share of the freight coming over the New Railway.

The government will be sustained, the scrapping politicians and editors will cool off, the sun will rise and set, and Canada experience five more years of prosperity just the same as if there had not been an election.

F. B. Carvell publicly announced himself at the court house as a believer in Chamberlain's policy. Vote for Carvell and thus send a man to Ottawa who will bind closer the bond of union between Canada and the Mother Country.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier will be sustained. The foreign owned four flusher organs who have been harping against the government will meet with a rebuke. The honest fair-minded electors of this Dominion cannot be influenced by side issues. The country is safe under liberal rule.

Electors, especially the young men who for the first time will cast a ballot, in this the first Canadian General Election of the century, support Frank Broadstreet Carvell, and the party he represents. In order to make some excuse for the non-appearance of Hon. A. G. Blair, whose expected participation in the fight against the government has heralded far and wide by some recently converted opposition organs, the excuse is set up that severe illness in the family of that gentleman kept him at home. This is only a bluff. The illness is not sufficiently grave to prevent a trip to St. Louis, or to interfere with plans laid for a European tour. The plain facts of the case are that Hon. A. G. Blair had no intention whatever of taking the stump, or of opposing the government, and so expressed himself to a prominent liberal less than a month ago.

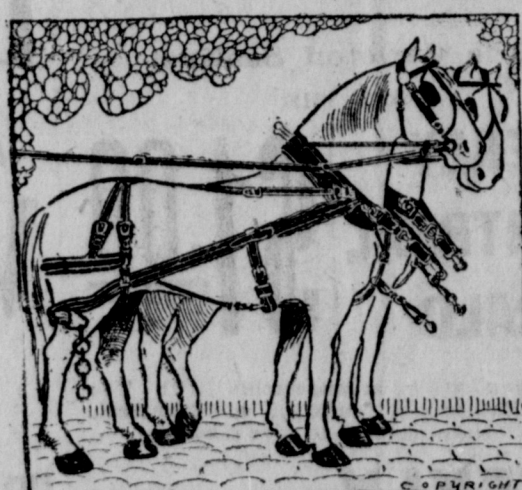
