## WHAT EMERSON SAYS.

The Toronto *World* is publishing a series of articles respecting the resignation of Hon. A. G. Blair, and the events that led up to it. There are rumors that a big syndicate was formed to build the Eastern Section of the G. T. P., and failing to secure satisfaction from Hon. Mr. Emerson and the government, the syndicate started in to "bust" the outfit. This is what Mr. Emerson said to an Ottawa correspondent:—"I have no hesitation in telling you all I know about it," said Mr. Emerson. "I was in New York on the 18th of September, and a gentleman approached me at the hotel I was staying at and asked me if there was no chance of getting a contract for the construction of the transcontinental railway. The elections, he said, were coming off and if a contract was obtained there would be lots of money to swell the campaign fund. I told him that the work would have to be done by Canadian contractors, and refused to have anything to do with him.

"He told me that they were working through Montreal people and I knew afterwards that Montreal parties acted very suddenly and peculiarly during the campaign. At the hotel was J. N. Greenshields of Montreal. The Montreal people were said to be friends of David Russell. During the elections David Russell, J. N. Greenshields, two Americans, Dr. Kennedy and a Mr. Green, said to be an Englishman, who resided in the States for some years, visited my province.

"They were riding in a magnificent private car and at Fredericton Junction on October 22, met Mr. R. L. Borden, apparently by appointment. Mr. Borden went on board, having been met at the station by Mr. Downing private secretary of Mr. David Russell. During the run to St. John Mr. Borden, Mr. Greenshields and others were closeted together.

"Immediately afterwards David Russell was boasting and betting of carrying the whole province of New Brunswick for the Conservatives. His newspaper, formerly the Liberal organ of the party, was turned into a campaign sheet against the Liberals. I was to be defeated at any cost. Mr. Russell's party was also met by Powell and other candidates and leading Conservatives in the province. New life was thrown into the Conservative cause, and while I don't know where the money came from, I do know there was plenty of it found its way to the constituencies and was handled by the Conservatives.

In the Province of Quebec La Presse was captured. But this was only preliminary work. There was, so I am told, to be on nomination day some twenty-five Liberal members who would retire. In this way twenty-five Conservatives would be elected in that province by acclamation, and this would secure the return of the Conservatives, when R. L. Borden would have charge of the construction of the transcontinental line and the giving out of the contracts. In connection with the resignation of Mr. Blair it may be mentioned that four days afterwards there appeared in a New York financial paper that he was to be the head of a syndicate for which the capital had been secured to control the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific. But something went wrong, and the plan of campaign fell through. "That," said Mr. Emerson, "is what I know and what I have heard about it."

Mr. Russell has denied that he was a party to any corrupt deal. Hon. Mr. Blair has, in the most emphatic manner, contradicted the *World* articles. The public wants the facts regarding the whole matter. In due course the truth will come to light. Mr. Borden certainly was pleased with Mr. Russell's attempt to beat the government. When sitting at dinner in this town he was handed a copy of a St. John paper containing the fake announcement that David Russell had bought the *Herald*. The leader was tickled to death. Like many others he took the bait and swallowed the worm, hook and all.
