Alien Immigration Into Britain

Alien immigration into Britain is now being viewed with greater alarm than it is even in this country. There the capacity to assimilate such incomers is distinctly limited, and there is no restriction upon the amount or character of the influx. It has long been well known as the common rendezvous of all political exiles, and it would seem now to have become the haven of the criminals generally of other countries. This is apparent from the high proportion of crime among the immigrants. In London alone 13,134 aliens have been convicted of crime since the influx began, and this has cost the metropolitan taxpayers about \$630,000. These immigrants are not so much adding to the population as changing its character, especially in the large districts of London selected as the locations of foreign colonies, where the native has almost disappeared before the army of invaders. The character of the invaders in certain of these districts is shown from the fact that many parish churches have been converted into Jewish synagogues. The general overcrowding has had the result of raising rents to figures which are impossible for the native London poor. The rents in Stepney

for example are, per unit of area, on an average three times higher than those of any other part of London. As a consequence the language, too, is disappearing from these surrendered districts; and the general conditions of life have become so unfamiliar that the local machinery provided for relief breaks down in every attempt to deal with it. That it has a very prejudicial effect upon the labour market is undoubted. In Scotland—in mining districts particularly—it has had a very bad effect. There it would seem as if the aliens were going to supplant the natives entirely.

A strict alien immigration law would seem to be one of the most urgent needs in Britain to-day.
