A two-fold grief hangs over the home of Michael Gallagher for in less than five months two deaths have taken place in the family. On July 11th, a bright, young son, Michael, aged 28 years, was killed at Woodstock Yard by attempting to catch his runaway team, and about five o'clock on Sunday morning, Dec 4th, the beloved wife and mother of the home passed peacefully away, aged 66 years. During the last fifteen years she had been troubled with heart failure; about six weeks ago she took a serious sick spell, which confined her to her bed for two weeks, after which she rallied sufficiently to be able to be about the house for part of the day. On Thursday morning, Dec 1st, she was sitting in the kitchen talking to her daughter, Gertrude, and suddenly took a partial paralysis and became speechless; she was carried to the bed from which she never arose or gained consciousness, and died Sunday morning. She is survived by her mother, husband, six children and five grandchildren. Mrs Gallagher was the only child of Mr and Mrs John Smith, Hartland, N.B. She will be greatly missed by all who knew her; always cheerful, kind and sympathetic, she leaves a host of friends, who sympathize with the family in their sad and irreparable loss. Mrs Gallagher was buried on Wednesday, Dec 7th. High Requiem mass was celebrated, after which the remains were interred in the cemetery of St Joseph's church. The pall bearers were John McGuire, Sr, Charles Cunningham, Sr, Hugh Johnston and Thomas Crayne.

SIR FREDERICK BORDEN.

During the recent electoral contest we called repeated attention to the splendid administrative record of Sir Frederick Borden as Minister of Militia. We have since pointed out the exceptionally favorable reception which his new Militia measure has received from the Old Country Press, which has been constrained to acknowledge that even Lord Dundonald, the pet of so many of its members could have devised nothing more satisfactory.

Sir Frederick is universally admitted to be the most capable and progressive Minister of Militia that Canada has had for many years past, if not in all her history.

But Sir Frederick, while given due credit for his public achievements, has scarcely got the measure of justice due him for his splendid although unostentatious service, as a party leader and worker. He has borne there with placid equanimity, treating them with the contempt which they deserved. He has merely smiled when they nicknamed him; and modestly borne the title with which his Sovereign has honored him in recognition of his distinguished services to Canada and the Empire.

Sir Frederick—as the Liberals of Nova Scotia well know, although he has been somewhat overshadowed of late in the public mind by the outstanding prominence of Mr Fielding, the long-tried Liberal leader, who has for so many years been recognized as the chief standard-bearer of the party in this Province, contributed his full proportion to the recent magnificent victory. In no part of Canada did the Dundonald incident count for so little as in Nova Scotia. This was unquestionably due entirely to the recognized merits of Sir Frederick as the responsible Minister, and because of the confidence which the Militia of Nova Scotia as a body had in him. Had the affair been handled less judiciously by and for Sir Frederick, it might have involved serious consequences for the Government in this strongly Scottish Province. As it was, not a vote was lost, and the probability is that many were won for the Administration through it.

Sir Frederick's triumph in his own County was the most signal in all Nova Scotia, and was noteworthy even among the greatest victories scored in the Dominion. It was strongly emphasized by the fact that Sir Frederick by no means confined

his personal efforts to his own constituency, but went about helping others as freely and generously as did even Mr Fielding.

These are facts, we say, which are known to all Liberals, they are not likely soon to be forgotten. They detract nothing from the credit due Mr Fielding, who recognizes them as clearly as anyone. It is but fair that they should be publicly acknowledged.

Sir Frederick Borden is a worker rather than a talker, although he is nevertheless one of the most graceful and effective public speakers in Canada. Both his speeches and his works during the recent campaign entitle him to the lasting gratitude of the Liberal party in Nova Scotia and the Dominion.—Chronicle.
