Activity in the West.

Advices from the west indicate great activity on the part of the friends of the government. In the recent Manitoba and British Columbia local elections there were unfortunate local differences that contributed largely towards the defeat of the party. Much has been done to overcome the effect of these divisions, so that it is confidently anticipated a big surprise will be given the gentlemen of the Tory persuasion who are claiming everything in sight from Lake Superior to the coast. The news from Manitoba is particularly encouraging. Conventions have been called in everyone of the ten ridings in that province and exceptionally strong men are offering themselves as candidates for the party. In the territories much quiet yet aggressive work has been accomplished, which will be felt on polling day. The liberals on the coast are unusually optimistic. They assert their belief in the ability of the party to make a clean sweep of the seven seats. There is no news from the Yukon, but as (Hon.) J. H. Ross had a big lead in the last contest he will probably win again. Altogether it would seem as if the current of feeling in the west is almost as strongly in favor of the Laurier government as indications seem to point in the maritime provinces.

MR. BOURASSA.

There seems to be some misapprehension about the political character and aims of Mr Bourassa. He is simply a typical French-Canadian, tenacious, like his compatriots, of their nationality, and opposed to Imperialism as threatening to it, but, like the bulk of them, perfectly contented with present political arrangements. It was as an opponent of Imperialism that he voted against the contingent and was heartily supported by his compatriots in so doing. There is nothing revolutionary about him; he wishes to keep things as they are. His stability and courage are giving him a strong hold on French-Canadians, who look to him for leadership in resistance to the imperializing tendencies of the Chamberlain movement. Sir Wilfrid Laurier sees this, and naturally is inclined to keep on good terms with Mr Bourassa. There is no other political tie between them. The idea that Sir Wilfrid inspires Mr Bourassa's speeches is absurd.—Exchange.
