NEW LAW FOR GERMANY.

Urged on by an aggressive campaign of the various temperance societies, the German Government has proposed a law containing some restrictive and prohibitory features in connection with the drink traffic.

The proposed law contains some novel features, but is by no means as severe in its conditions as those in force in some other European countries. Saloonkeepers will be required to keep on sale such non-intoxicants as lemonade, milk, tea, coffee and also cold foods. The number of barmaids is limited, and, perhaps most important of all, credit is prohibited. The credit system flourishes especially in saloons in the country districts and manufacturing towns, and is held responsible for much of the increase of intemperance. It is believed that the new bill will become a law, and when enforced with characteristic German thoroughness is likely to do much to abate the drink evil, the spread of which has caused so much discussion in the German press and government circles.

Banish Brandy and Beer from the German Army.

The following cable dispatch we commend to President Roosevelt and the War Department at Washington:

"It is becoming more and more evident that the Kaiser intends to reform the German army into a strict temperance organization, by abolishing the sale of alcoholic beverages at all canteens. Experiments have been made at different army posts, especially at Nuremberg, where the canteens during the last few months have sold nothing but tea, coffee and lemonade, without a single protest from the rank and file. The issue of brandy and beer as part of the army ration will, it is said, be abolished throughout the whole empire in the near future."

How the Liquor Traffic Robs Laboring Men.

In \$100 worth of boots and shoes \$20.71 is labor.

In \$100 worth of furniture \$23.77 is labor.

In \$100 worth of hardware \$24.17 is labor.

In \$100 worth of clothing \$17.12 is labor.

In \$100 worth of cotton goods \$16.91 is labor.

In \$100 of men's furnishings \$18.34 is labor.

In \$100 worth of worsted \$13.55 is labor.

In \$100 worth of woollen goods \$12.86 is labor.

In \$100 worth of liquor you buy \$1.23 is labor.

One dollar and twenty-three cents as against \$12.86, \$13.55, \$18.34, \$16.91, \$17.42, \$20.71, \$23.77, \$25.17! What an object lesson!

In the above goods, in each \$800 lot, is \$147.73 labor employed.

For one year, 30 cents a day for drinks, will make \$109.50. Call it \$100. If eight laboring men spend \$800 for furniture, hardware, boots and shoes, clothing and other good things, they and their families are made happy, but \$147.43 goes to labor. Thus business is stimulated, labor is in demand and wages are likely to rise.

If the \$800 is spent in the saloon, only \$9.84 goes for labor. The man and his family get no benefit. He is made weaker for his work. He is less pleasant and affable in his home. Comforts are not there. Wife is not cheerful. Children do not love the home. He is more likely to lose his job. Everything is against him.

Suppose 100 laboring men in a town, spending 30 cents a day in saloons, quit the saloons, and spend the money for clothing, houses, furniture and good things, how quickly would the town put on a new face. New stores and new factories would be needed. The saloon is the greatest pauperizer. Close it and as by an electric torch the poor houses would close also.
