SIX WARS.

Though it is absorbing nearly all public interest the war between Japan and Russia is far from being the only one which is at present disturbing the peace of the world. That seemingly interminable war in which the United States became involved with the Moros through its uncalculated purchase of their country, the Philippines, is still going on, and with about as little prospect of a satisfactory settlement as ever—they will be dear islands to that country when all is done. It has become a proverb that Britain is always at war, in one part of the globe or another and at present she may be said to have three small wars on hand: first, there is that expedition to "the roof of the world," Tibet, but which has for its sole object to peacefully (if possible) induce the Thibetans, despite pernicious Russian influence, to keep an open door for British commerce as agreed upon, and Colonel Younghusband reports that they are now conscious of Britain's power and are willing to negotiate with the mission; second, there is that war in Somaliland, on the east coast of Africa, on behalf of Egypt, against the Mad Mullah, but which, seeing he has fled, may now be regarded as almost finally settled; and third, there is that little war in Nigeria, on the west coast of Africa, and which evidently calls for a stronger British force being forwarded before its punitive object can be fully accomplished. Finally, Germany is engaged in war in southwestern Africa against the restless and rebellious Hereros. Of course, ultimately, this war can have but one result, the subjection of the Hereros, but it is to be feared Germany has been treating the trouble too lightly, and will now have to adopt far more severe measures. In a recent engagement no fewer than two officers and seven men were killed and fourteen were wounded.

The Open Door Needed.

There is one way in which the I. C. R. management might bring about a genuine reform. That is to allow the Dominion Express Company the privilege of carrying parcels to every station on the People's Railway that is reached by the Canadian Express Company. For instance, under the existing arrangements, if a person in Woodstock wishes to send a small parcel, say to Annapolis, he must pay about 65 or 70 cents, being the cost of carriage to St John by the Dominion people, and the charge from that point to the destination by the other company. If the Dominion Express Company could secure the right to open an office at the destination the rate would be scarcely more than the rate to St John, or very little above half the present charge. Boards of Trade all over the provinces are agitating this matter.

ILLUSTRATION ORCHARDS.

The New Brunswick Government this spring inaugurates a forward movement in fruit-growing by setting out eight illustration orchards. The principle is the same as in the case of the creameries, the cheese-curing and poultry-fattening stations, started by Prof Jas W Robertson, the Dominion Agricultural and Dairy Commissioner. Last year the New Brunswick Government caused spraying outfits to be operated in several parts of the Province, and encouraged by the results, they take the still more advanced step to demonstrate in different localities the principles and practice of up-to-date orcharding. The intention is to continue until every county in the Province has at least one illustration orchard. As a preliminary condition, the owner of the land cultivates and manures the land liberally the previous season. The Government furnishes the trees, and send a man to direct the proper planting and laying out of the orchard. Mostly winter varieties of trees will be planted, and the efforts confined almost wholly to apples and plums, which will be set out between the rows of apples, as they come into bearing early, and may be removed when the apple trees mature. The trees being properly set out, the owner of the land must sign an agreement that he will attend to the orchard for ten years, according to instructions issued him. He will be allowed the entire receipts of the enterprise. The orchards will be from one to two acres in extent, and be composed of 50 to 100 trees. These will be set in rows, 30 feet apart. On each side of the row a space 75 feet in width will be kept absolutely free from growth

and cultivated from time to time. In the fall a cover growth of clover will be planted on this strip. It can scarcely be doubted that good results will follow if such a plan is intelligently followed for a number of years. We will follow with great interest the results of these object lessons in fruit growing.
