One of the most needed, and one of the most useful of modern benevolent organizations, is the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children. Its object is to protect the victims of parental brutalities, or of cruel neglect. Its sphere of action is chiefly among the degraded child in a well-furnished home that is suffering badly from bad management or parental ignorance or false views of parental duty. An immense number of fathers and mothers need to have the solemn caution which Reuben gave to his churlish brother, "Do not sin against the child."

There is no trust in this world more tremendous than the trust of parentage; and none which many persons seem to treat more lightly. In like manner we can detect the fingermarks and footprints of parental influence upon the character of children when grown to manhood and womanhood; and they are not very ornamental, either.

> Children are imitative creatures and we all know how tendencies to good or evil character spring from parental influence, and the chief element in moral heredity is the force of example. THE POULTRY MARKETS.

It would seem to be the part of wisdom for our poultry raisers to hatch all the chickens and turkeys possible this spring, as not only is there an excellent outlook for a local demand, but there are also inquiries from exporters.

Last year a small trade was started with South Africa in this line, and already enquiries are being made as to birds for that market. One dealer has told the writer that he wants 2,000 turkeys from New Brunswick for an October shipment, and that if the quality is right he will require many more. Chickens, properly fattened and packed, and in considerable quantities will also be required.

Every possible effort should, there-fore, be made to hatch as many birds as possible this Spring, if advantage is to be taken of the very evident demand that has opened up.
