NORWAY.

In Norway drunkenness is punished by imprisonment. As soon as a man is incarcerated the delinquent has a loaf and wine morning and evening. The bread is served in a wooden bowl full of wine, in which it has been soaking for an hour. The first day the drunkard swallows his allowance willingly enough. The second day it seems less pleasing. At the end of eight or ten days prisoners have been known to abstain altogether from the food thus pitilessly presented. This course of treatment finished, the drunkard, except in rare instances, is radically cured.

LOUISIANA.

"The Order of the Knights of Temperance," is the name of a new society formed in New Orleans. A member is pledged to refrain from the use of alcoholic stimulants only while his membership continues. He may resign at any time, and return to his tipping if he chooses. That is a matter for himself to decide. All questions relating to the manufacture or sale of alcoholic drinks are left to the individual conscience of the membership, and there is no agitation of the prohibition question. It is said that the order is flourishing and that its membership has been extended not only in New Orleans, but in other cities of the South.

AUSTRIA.

According to the National Zeitung, the Polish Nationalists in the town of Thorn have determined to drink no more German beer. The ground of this self-denying ordinance is, it appears, the refusal of the innkeepers and restaurateurs of Thorn to let the Poles rooms for the holding of meetings. This refusal is much resented by them, and at a large meeting held a few days ago it was resolved—

"That money spent on alcoholic liquors goes for the most part into the pockets of the men who refuse us the use of their halls and rooms for meetings and theatrical performances. Besides this, alcohol is very prejudicial to health. We therefore look upon the fight against alcohol and the spread of total abstinence as of the utmost national and social importance, and resolve to further them to the utmost of our ability."

Austria is considering a law which provides that drunkards shall, after ten convictions, be sent to a reformatory, there to be imprisoned till physicians certify that their craving is cured.
