What Goldwin Smith Says.

Thanks to the telegraph, the whole world can form a ring around Russia and Japan, enjoying the grand prize fight. Sporting sympathy is naturally with Japan. Each combatant is fighting for a substantial object; Russia for open ports on the Pacific, Japan for control of her neighborhood, and of her destined field of extension. It may be thought not impossible that a way of adjusting the rival interests might have been found by a judicious friend. But this is not at present the way of the world. Who struck the first blow can hardly be doubted. Russia was evidently un-

prepared, Japan was thoroughly prepared, and eager for the fray. Japan probably resolved on war when the Lansdowne treaty assured her that she would have Great Britain on her side. Signs multiply of the inclination of China to cast in her lot with Japan and accept Japanese leadership. If that union ensues, the specter of the Yellow Peril will take a substantial form. There will be no more carving out of China into spheres of influence. The question will be whether Japan and China combined may not retaliate on the Eastern possessions of Western powers.—(Goldwin Smith.)

WHAT ABOUT THIS?

A Former New Brunswicker Gives an Old Theory a Rude Jolt.

HAS THE EARTH A MAGNETIC POLE?

Editor Free Press:—

In your last evening's edition you call attention to the fact that a new expedition is being equipped to discover the exact locality of the earth's magnetic pole. So early as 1884 I pointed out that the fact that the needle points north is no evidence that a terrestrial magnetic pole exists but that such position of the needle demonstrates that an electric current perpetually runs round our planet—and all the other planets from east to west. At some points this current slightly shifts its direction and hence the variation of the needle. In the province of Kursk in Russia, this variation was recently found to be "from 34 degrees east to 96 degrees west" in an area of two square miles.

If a mariner's compass be placed over a wire connecting Ottawa and New York the needle will point west if the current on the wire is running from Ottawa to New York but it will point east if the current is running from New York to Ottawa. That is the needle will always point to the right of the direction in which the current is running. The very fact, therefore, that the needle points northward is the best possible evidence that an electric current runs round the earth from east to west.

It was on this current I proposed in 1884 to send wireless messages round the world. I have no doubt Marconi received the letter S at Newfoundland as he frequently asserted at the time from his station in Cornwall but he never sent a message in the opposite direction because there is no current. True, he asserted that he sent the President's congratulatory message to King Edward by his "wireless" but subsequently confessed he sent it by cable. So his attempt to telegraph across the current has proved a failure, his effort to send wireless messages across the Straits of Belleisle only 12 miles having been abandoned in despair.
