## RUM TRAFFIC NOTES.

## DOFF THEIR HATS.

In Russia the Minister of Finance has issued an order that hats must be doffed to bartenders in whiskey shops, as they are government officials.

It may come to this in Canada if government control of the liquor traffic should be adopted, as is anticipated by some people.

## A KING'S POSITION.

An evidence of the growth of temperance sentiment in Scandinavia is found in a news item which says that Oscar II, King of Sweden and Norway, has acceded to a petition from his temperance subjects and decided that hereafter battleships are to be christened with water, not wine.

## TEMPERANCE HOSPITAL.

The Medical Record makes the announcement that a hospital to cost \$75,000, is to be erected in Chicago, the physicians of which must use no alcohol in their prescriptions. The hospital will be called the Frances E Willard National Temperance Hospital. The three schools of practice—regular, homoeopathic, and eclectic—will be represented on the medical staff.

## SCOUNDRELS.

American whalers are accused of selling liquor to the Indians in the far north, near the mouth of the Mackenzie River. Indians are madly eager for liquor. The Canadian authorities and the Hudson Bay Company do all they can to keep liquor from the Indians and the Indians from liquor. Irresponsible adventurers from the United States have no scruples in giving the Indian all he can take so long as he has furs or anything of value to part with. All rum-sellers are the same kind.

## A PROHIBITION STATE.

Five great Indian tribes have been for many years located in Indian Territory. They are in the main civilized and Christianized. They are ready for statehood, and are preparing to organize a new state to be named "Jefferson." One of the fundamental principles of the new state will be the prohibition of the liquor traffic and the tavern. This is a rebuke to white men who have not the courage, the self-denial and the Christian principle required for such a step. It is expected that the new state will be set up in 1906.

## A JUST JUDGE.

We need more such judges as the one who presides over a Pittsburg, Pa., court. When the officers made their report to the court the judge said:—

"Gentlemen, it is very strange that the daily newspapers contain accounts of continuous violations of the liquor laws, and everybody seems to know it except you gentlemen, whose sworn duty it is to return such cases. You may take the returns you have handed in and the court will give you until two o'clock to make truthful returns or you will get yourselves into trouble." They did not get themselves into trouble because they returned several saloonkeepers for violation of the law.

## The Franchise Question Again to the Fore.

From the Daily News, London, Eng. we glean that a deputation of ladies recently waited upon Mr John Morley, and laid before him the claims of women to Parliamentary franchise. The Countess of Aberdeen introduced the deputation, and a number of the ladies clearly and cogently stated their case. Among those speaking were Mrs King Roberts, Miss Agnes Slack and Mrs T B Buchanan.

Mr Morley accorded the deputation a most sympathetic hearing, and stated in reply:—

"That the retrogressive action of Parliament in limiting the position of women upon local bodies had, among more general arguments, convinced him of the soundness of the view that the possession of the Parliamentary franchise was the only effective way of securing the just claim of women to a full and direct share in that social work where their interests are most deeply concerned, and where their influence and their services would be of the highest value."

## Correct Manners at Table.

Here are a few rules applicable to the dinner party or to the nursery. It is in the latter place that good manners should be first inculcated. The child who is allowed to behave awkwardly at meals will probably do so as a man or a woman.

On seating oneself at the table, gloves, if worn, should be removed, the table napkin opened out and placed on the lap.

Bread may be placed either at the right or left side.

Soup—Only small helpings of soup are given—half a ladleful is generally considered quite enough—and it is eaten as noiselessly as possible from the side of the table. It is allowable to tilt the plate slightly away from one while taking the last spoonful, but never toward one.

When eating sweet dishes the fork is held in the right hand and is used exclusively as far as possible. It is only for stewed fruits, milky puddings and other semi-liquid dishes that the spoon is called into service.

At dessert, apples, pears, etc., are peeled and are then cut up to the right size for eating off a fork. Grapes are conveyed to the mouth by the fingers, and the stone and skin are passed from the mouth to the hand, and then laid on the plate.

Refinement in eating and drinking cannot be too strongly insisted upon. Even little children should be taught to place quite small portions of food in their mouths, to keep the lips closed during the process of mastication, and never to drink while they have food in their mouths. Drinking while eating often leads to a choking fit both alarming and unpleasant to witness.

Crumbling one's bread, fidgetting with spoon and fork, digging in the salt-cellar, and other nervous tricks in which some people indulge while talking, are all bad habits to overcome.
