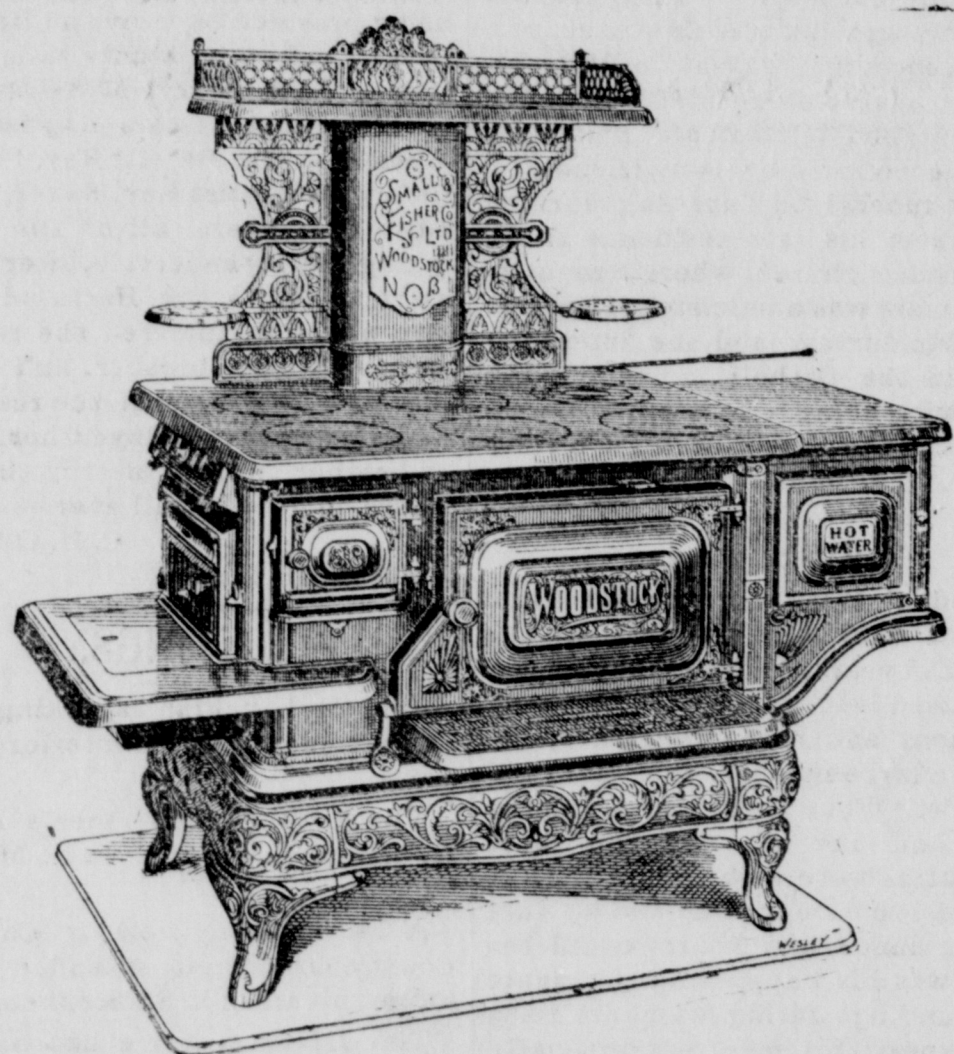

Hope the names of guilty parties
may be published."

strike me as rather peculiar about
the prescriptions put up at some of

and a label with the same name on
it and directions, but when my hus-
band wants a vial, without a doc-

in a bottle with no proprietor's name
on it and he can get as many as he
likes on the same order, all he needs
is the money."

making among his fellow creatures

A man that can't buy liquor himself,
will give the money to one of these
fellows, and he will go and get it for
him. Of all mean men in the world,
these "go betweens" are the mean-
est.
