THE EXHIBITS.

Nova Scotia had the most exhibits, and got most of the Prizes. New Brunswick had a good exhibit of poultry, and some choice swine, but only a few cattle. PE Island showed sheep and poultry.

Pure Bred Shorthorns, Herefords and Polled Angus, with their grades, were shown, and displayed great improvement over previous years. The Shorthorns were most numerous, but in the Grade Classes Hereford Grades were among the top notches largely due to the grand exhibit made by W W Black, Sackville, N B. The yearling Grade Class was pronounced a better lot than the same Class at the Guelph Show. The first prize, two year old Grade Hereford took 1st prize also as a Dressed Careass.

The Sheep Classes were very strong in Shropshires and Oxford Downs, and their grades. Some good animals were to be found in other Classes, but the above mentioned led in numbers and quality, Grades shown by Logan Bros., Amherst, taking the award for the best flock.

The Swine Classes did not show the improvement that might have been expected, as out of 40 hogs slaughtered, only five were marked as good bacon carcasses.

Some of the best exhibits were not slaughtered, CF Rogers, Woodstock N. B. showing some Yorks that were specially mentioned by the Judges. The Live Poultry was, in most

lines, a superior lot, the Barred Plymouth Rocks and Wyndottes receiving special mention. The display of "Utility" birds was pronounced the best ever shown in Canada. Turkeys were a good class, but later Fowl only fair. The Dressed Poultry included a fine exhibit from the Nova Scotia Provincial Farm, but outside of this it was not of the highest quality, many of the best fattened birds were poorly dressed.

The Fruit exhibits, while not large, showed that all these Maritime Provinces could produce articles of the highest quality. Six Counties in Nova Scotia, six Counties in New Brunswick and the three Counties of P E Island had exhibits. The following gentlemen acted as
