

So summary an ending of life, however, is sure to arouse doubt and suspicion. even in cases of mutilation where death is certain. Still more unsatisfactory would it be in cases of helpless old age or chronic suffering, as in that of a woman who recently died after being bed ridden and in constantoften excruciating-pain for more than thirty years, and where practicable it should be essential to have the request or consent of the patient to end a miserable and hopeless existence. As a safeguard, it should be necessary to have such acquiescence made in the presence of at least the physician and a notary, the sworn report of these witnesses to be filed with the town records.


Rev. Mr. Bonnell's Report.

Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of me-quarter section of 160 acres, more or

#### ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situated, receive authority for some to make entry for him. A fee of \$10

#### HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provi-sions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments there to, to perform the condi-tions connected therewith, under one of the

and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require a settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute stock; and 20 head of cattle, to be actually his own property, with buildings for their ac-commodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resided upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has (3) It a section was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has permanent resid-ence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the require-ments of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township, or an ad-ioning or cornering township.

The privilege of a second entry is re-stricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first home-steads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who fails to comply

with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.


