Information About North-west Lands.

1. What is the price of good framing land in Northern Alberta between 15 and 20 miles back from town or station? 2. What number of acres is to be broken up each year in the homesteading duties? 3. It is who is the sole head of a family, or any with single furrow or two furrow male over 18 years of age, to the extent of ploughs they break the sod out one quarter section of 160 acres, more or west? 4. Which is the better grain growing district, Northern Alberta or Assiniboia? 5. About what date do they generally sow the following grains, wheat, oats and barley? Ans.—From three to ten dollars per acre, but 160 acres of land can be homesteaded on payment of ten dollars. 2. It is not necessary to break up any quantity of land in growing district, Northern Alberta break up any quantity of land in break up any quantity of land in order to secure a homestead, but merely to build a house and reside on the place at least six months in each year for three years. 3. Breaking is usually done with a single furrow-breaking plough. 4. Assiniboia is considered the best wheat growing district. 5. All seeding of grain is done as early as the soil is in a fit condition to receive it, usually in March or April.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, and the amendments there to, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. It is the practice of the Department to require a settler to bring 15 acres under cultivation, but if he prefers he may substitute stock; and 20 head of cattle, to be actually his own property, with buildings for their accommodation, will be accepted instead of the cultivation.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased), of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resided upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence

requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has permanent resid-

ence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or and to indicate the same township, or an ad-

joining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for


